FROM THE BOOK OF JOE

Dear Parish Family,

Since the announcement of my reassignment, so many people have come up to me and told me that I have had an impact on their lives, which is a wonderful and kind thing to know. What those dear souls do not know is the impact they and this whole community have had on me, in

my ongoing formation as a priest and a human being. This is a great gift. The gift that you have given to me will have an effect on the two new parishes I will be serving: the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Brockport and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Hamlin. Not to mention the wonderful migrant community and the students at SUNY Brockport and —oh yeah—all the service members in the National Guard.

The other thing that everybody has been asking me is, how am I doing? Honestly, I have been so busy with moving and army and finalizing weddings and baptisms, and so on, I have not had time to reflect on my own feelings. Of course, I am deeply saddened even though I know this is part of the vocation that I have agreed to. Nonetheless, I am sad. I was talking to Mickey Herzog, who herself is grieving, and I told her it was like uprooting a plant that has long established roots. It's hard. Although I will not physically be with you, no one can remove you from my heart. I feel like I'm going to become one of those "I'll see you at funerals and weddings" relatives, but even if that's the only time we get to see each other, know that you are always in heart, in my prayer.

I want to thank—well, everyone, but in particular, those young people I have journeyed with for these last thirteen years. I baptized many of you. I was there when you experienced God's mercy and forgiveness on the day of your first reconciliation (may it not be your last). I was humbled when you came to join the rest of the community around the table of the Lord when you celebrated your First Communion. I was so proud of you when you were confirmed in the Holy Spirit. And several of you have invited me to officiate at your weddings. You have no idea how much joy you bring to my heart!

For those of you whom I served during the most painful times, when you were sick or your beloved died, thank you for inviting me into the most sacred moments of your lives. I am humbled and honored to serve you.

As for the future, it belongs to you — the great people of the community of St. Catherine of Siena. The success or failure of this community is entirely in your hands. You have been through many transitions, and each new leader adds their own experience of the Resurrected Christ to yours. I have seen the kingdom of God blossom in Ithaca through your hands. I have no fear that you will not continue the good work that God has begun in you.

May God bless you and keep you, may God's face shine upon you, may God be gracious to you, may God turn toward you and give you peace. Fr. John is unbelievably blessed to be coming to you.




