

MIGRANT DINNER AUGUST 25

The Peace and Justice Committee is organizing a dinner this Friday, August 25, for the migrant workers in King Ferry. It is important that our community offer an



evening of food and hospitality for these workers, who harvest the fresh fruits and vegetables we enjoy yearround. These workers "move throughout the country harvesting the food our nation both eats and exports. Each year is like a string of beads—a month of employment here, another

there, tied together with travel in search of more work," according to the Social Ministry Committee of the Good Shepherd Catholic Community in Aurora.

Due to the physical conditions at the camp, sanitary laws, and the wishes of the farm owner, we cannot cook food at the camp, and there are strict rules on what we can and cannot pre-cook. Thus we will need to bring food that is either commercially cooked or does not require cooking. Previously, we provided a healthy, protein-rich dinner (broiled chickens and sides purchased ready-to-eat from Wegmans) and they were a hit! We would like to repeat the menu this year.

We need your help to make this dinner possible!

- **Serving:** We will need volunteers to transport and serve the food, interact with the migrant workers, and provide them hospitality. We can also bring entertainment, like music or games to play.
- **Planning**: We need people to order the food, shop, pick it up, and prepare the other supplies that are needed for this dinner.
- **Donations**: In previous years, the meal cost about \$1,000. A few dollars from each family will supply all we need. Please make donations out to St. Catherine's with "Migrant Dinner" in the memo section. Donations should be in an envelope marked "Migrant Dinner" and placed in the collection baskets or offering boxes at church or dropped off at the Parish Center.

All are welcome to help with the dinner! Please keep in mind that the dinner is not a volunteer opportunity for young children. There is no safe place for them to play in the camp, and for that reason the farm owner strongly discourages their presence. We are looking only for adult volunteers and responsible teenagers for the dinner. To volunteer or if you have any questions, please email Mary Crosley at crosleym22@gmail.com.

There are tribal, Bokhara, and Persian rugs in every color to fit every room, in sizes ranging from 2' x 3' to 10' x 14'. 
