

UPDATES ON THE SYNOD

In October 2021, Pope Francis convened the Synod on Synodality. At that time, you might have wondered, what's a synod? Perhaps you still are! In winter/spring 2021–2022, we held a series of listening sessions, during which parishion ers answered questions (stcathofsiena.org/synod-2022) derived from the themes of this synod.

A synthesis of your responses was sent to Bishop Matano, where they were synthesized with those of other parishes. The diocese's report (dor.org/synod/) was sent to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, and they produced a synthesis of all the diocesan reports (usccb.org/resources/us-national-synthesis-2021-2023-synod). Last winter, the United States and Canada held twelve assemblies, which produced the North American Final Document for the Continental Stage (usccb.org/resources/north-american-final-document-continental-stage-2021-2024-synod). This report and six other continental reports were sent to Rome in March 2023.

Now what? From October 4–29, 2023, the first of two sessions of the Synod will be held at the Vatican. You can learn more about what the participants will pray about and discuss at usccb.org/resources/instrumentum-laboris-first-session-2021-2024-synod-synodal-church-communion-participation.






