

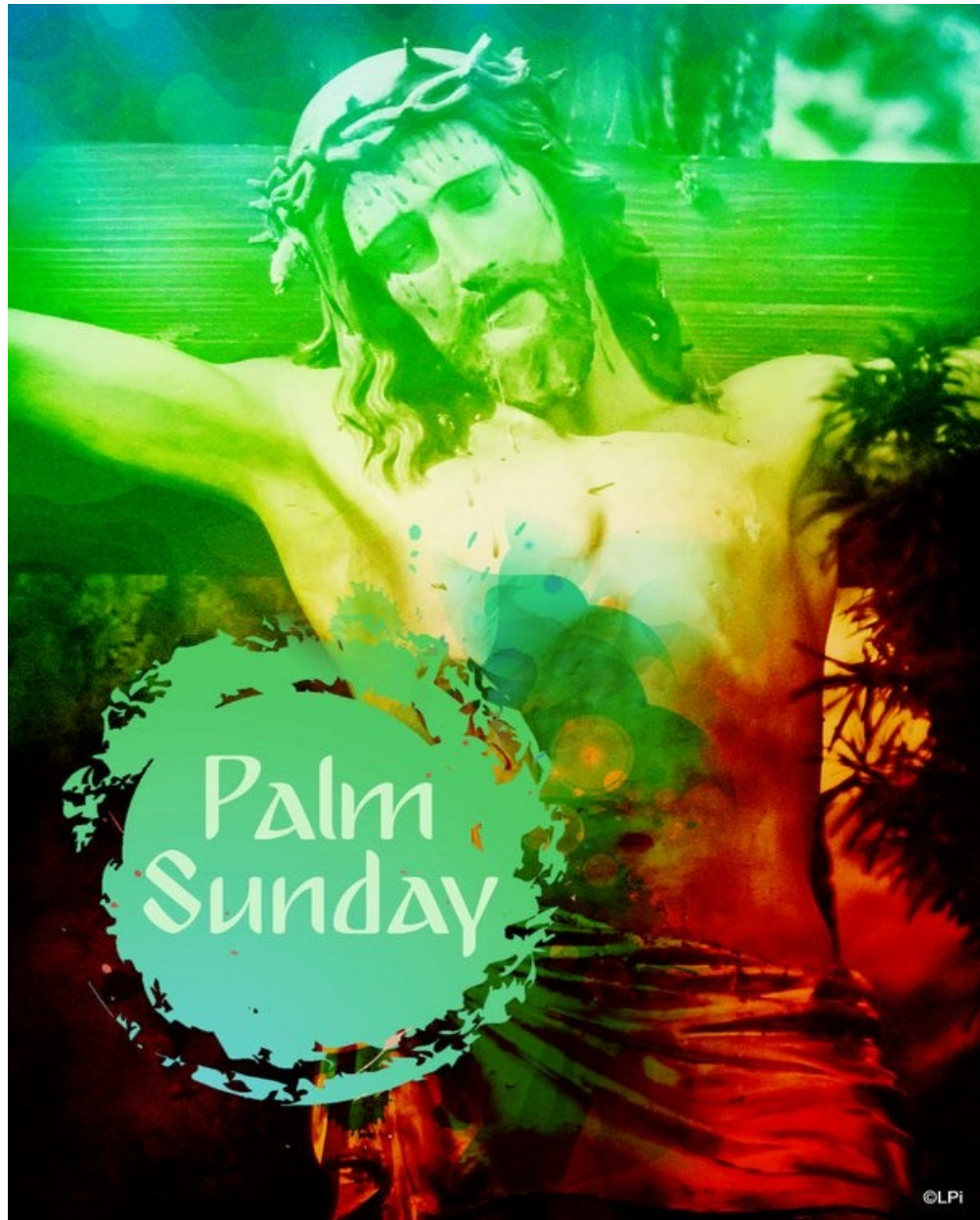

WHY IS ACHIEVING THE GOAL FOR THIS STRATEGIC INITIATIVE SO IMPORTANT?

- For St. Catherine’s to create a significant future, our parish must have financial stability as shown by a balanced operating revenues and expenses report each year.
- For 2024–25, the Task Force designed an initiative, so our parish could demonstrate its willingness to raise offertory giving by \$100,000. The parishioners’ generosity achieved this goal, thus demonstrating their commitment to maintaining balanced financial reports.
- For 2025–26, the newly renamed Treasury Development Committee again implemented the same initiative for a \$100,000 goal, so the parishioners could demonstrate their sustainability for having St. Catherine’s support a budget which would fully service the parish’s operational objectives.
- With a new future to create for St. Catherine’s, we believe this amount would provide the foundation for building our future.

PRESENTATION AT MARY, MOTHER OF GOD PARISH

On Wednesday, April 22, at 9:30 a.m. at St. Francis Solanus, St. Bernard's School of Theology and Ministry on the Road will be sending Professor Lisa Lickona, S.T.L. to give a presentation entitled *Encountering the Heart of Jesus*. This event is coordinated with the Wednesday 8:30 a.m Mass and the 9:00 a.m. coffee and pastries social.

Professor Lickona's ninety minute interactive presentation, *Encountering the Heart of Jesus* will invite us to ask ourselves, "What is our devotion to the Sacred Heart, and how can our devotion to Our Lord deepen our life of prayer?" She will explore the Sacred Heart Devotion through the writings of the saints and through Pope Francis' encyclical, *Dilexit Nos*---"He Loved Us."

In addition to being an Assistant Professor in Systematic Theology at St. Bernard's School of Theology and Ministry (Pittsford, NY), Lisa Lickona has extensively researched and written on the lives of the saints. Each month, at the St. Bernard's School, she offers to the public a half-day reflection and call to prayer where each person can learn about one of the saints, ask questions, and spend an hour in adoration. Professor Lickona has published essays in *Humanum*, *Catholic Social Science Review*, and *Ave Maria Law Review*. She has also been involved with the Elizabeth

Ann Seton Shrine in Emmitsburg, MD, especially as a speaker during the Shrine's anniversary celebrations last year.

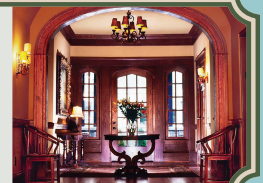
