The 100th Anniversary of the Apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima Part IV

Apparition of the Angel

Story continued from last week:

"Kneeling on the ground, he bowed down until his forehead touched the ground, and made us repeat these words three times:

"My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love You! I ask pardon of You for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love You." Then rising he said: "Pray thus. The Hearts of Jesus and Mary are attentive to the voice of your supplications."

Comment:

In last week's column I stated that in the Angel's appearance and message to the children, the concept of Marxist atheism which is the principle evil that our Lady will warn against is already being addressed, even without mentioning it, by the Angel's prayer. While our Lady will allude more directly to "Marxist" atheism, the Angel's prayer is offered in reparation for atheism. This is done first by a positive act of faith in God. This is a good formula for attacking the evils of our day. First give the positive response. For example: I am pro-life. This doesn't mean we should not address our opposition to evil in the negative response: I am anti-abortion, anti-euthanasia, anti-merci killing et cetera. So does the Angel in the prayer: "My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love You! An affirmation of the positive and what is truly good. Note the negative is still put in a constructive, not destructive, manner: "I ask pardon of you ..." Evil is a reality in our world. It must be addressed and confronted. Evil is not a thing in itself. Its reality is rooted in an absence, a negation, or a rejection of a good. Since God alone is goodness in Himself and all good comes from Him, any rejection of good is, in essence, a rejection of God. The best response to evil, and its inherent rejection/absence of good, is to proclaim and promote the good being rejected or negated. What good is it to condemn an evil without in turn proclaiming the good or not working to correct the harm done? In this case faith and mercy are the response to atheism.

Obviously an atheist will not adore, hope or love God. However, we can speak also of practical atheism. A practical atheist does not deny the existence of God, but lives as if God does not exist. There is no real trust in God or obedience to God and His commandments. Trust and obedience are necessary for true faith. Simply acknowledging God's existence is not faith. This prayer is as much a prayer of reparation for practical atheism as it is for atheism. To live without authentic adoration, hope and love of God you believe exist is worse than those who do not believe God exists.

"Pray thus" Obviously the Angel was asking the three children to pray in a spirit of adoration of God with mind, body and soul. The angel was not speaking to us. However, God did not want this story to be private between the children, the angel, Himself and Mary. He wanted the story told. The Angel is speaking to all of us. We should not minimize this request by simply repeating the words of the prayer in a posture of kneeling and putting our foreheads to the ground. This is a request that we too believe, adore, hope and love God in a spirit of profound adoration in mind, body and soul, and to do so in reparation for all who do not.

"The Hearts of Jesus and Mary are attentive to the voice of your supplications."

I am not going to comment on the "Hearts of Jesus and Mary" here. I will deal with this topic when we discuss the actual messages from our Lady. However, it is important to note that this prayer was directed towards the Hearts of Jesus and Mary. Mary will make known the need of reparation for the sins of atheism, practical included, by which the Hearts of Jesus and Mary are so wounded. She will specifically mention the errors of Russia, which are fundamentally atheistic Marxism.
