

The 100th Anniversary of the Apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima Part VII

Apparition of the Angel Story: Summer, 1916

Suddenly, we saw beside us the same figure, or rather Angel, as it seemed to me.

"What are you doing? Pray, pray very much! The most holy Hearts of Jesus and Mary have designs of mercy on you. Offer prayers and sacrifices constantly to the Most High."

"How are we to make sacrifices?" I asked.

"Make of everything you can a sacrifice, and offer it to God as an act of reparation for the sins by which He is offended, and in supplication for the conversion of sinners. You will thus draw down peace upon your country. I am its Angel Guardian, the Angel of Portugal. Above all, accept and bear with submission, the suffering which the Lord will send you."

Comment: We must not limit sins to what offends neighbor. For one thing, your good deeds might offend someone; are we not to do good deeds in fear of offending someone? Of course not. If it is contrary to the moral order that God has established and revealed, then we must not offend our neighbor. However, what if no one on earth is offended? If no one is hurt by my actions, thoughts, desires, and/or words, "What difference does it make?" What if even I do not detect any harm, even to myself? Who cares and why would God care? We may not care how holy we are, but God does. He cares because He wants nothing else but our eternal happiness with complete and perfect unity with Him in Heaven. Even the slightest, most private, of sins offends His love for us. That said, there certainly are enough very serious sins by which God and mankind are deeply offended. The focus here is the Angel's words, "sins by which He is offended,"

"You will thus draw down peace upon your country." Peace is the fruit of God's grace. The more abundant God's grace is in the world, the more abundant is peace. Sin impedes the flow of God's grace to the world. Now, of course, God is not impeded by our sin. He certainly can overcome the obstacle of sin in our lives and bear the fruit of peace. However, we must take two things in consideration. If God grants us His peace when we are not at peace with God, then it would be a lie. God is Truth. Jesus says: "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life." God does not lie. Also, God has willed that we be the stewards of His grace. While He certainly does not need us, He wants us to be fully incorporated in His mystery of our Redemption, not just recipients of it, but ministers of it and even participants in the act of Redemption. From the beginning God has willed that His Grace should flow to the world through us. Grace flows from Christ to us and from us to the world. The children have been asked to make up for these sins that have impeded the work of God's Grace to bring peace to Portugal, and even the whole world. Through their prayers and sacrifice they will make reparation to God; the Grace that has been impeded will now flow through them to Portugal, bearing the fruit of peace.

"I am its Angel Guardian, the Angel of Portugal." I cannot tell you how many times I have come across priests, scholars and professors who have denied the existence of angels and scoffed at the notion of guardian angels. You might be puzzled by this because it seems so obvious from Scripture that angels exist. I do not have the time or purpose to explain how they can deny the existence of angels in light of Sacred Scripture and Church teaching, but trust me many do. They think it is simplistic, childish, and rooted in ignorance of modern scripture scholarship—that scriptural talk of "angels" is just a literary device and should not be taken literally. They dismiss the Church's teaching as archaic, simplistic, and undefined. What arrogance. "I give praise to you Almighty Father, for what you have hidden from the wise and clever, you have revealed to the merest children." Angels definitely do exist (there are angel guardians), and now we know there are angel guardians even of nations.

Prayer: Angel guardian of our nation, the Angel of the United States of America, protect and guide our nation toward peace, justice, mercy, and love in the fullness of Truth, especially for all the children in our country – including the child in the womb. Amen.
