DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

The second Sunday of Easter is the Feast of Divine Mercy. This is in fulfillment of the will of Jesus Christ who revealed to St. Faustina Kowalski (A nun from Poland who lived 1905-1938) His desire that the Feast of Mercy be celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Our Lord also revealed to St. Faustina His desire that devotion to the Divine Mercy be promulgated in conjunction with veneration of the image of Divine Mercy that He requested be painted. This is the image that hangs above the organ. To quote our Lord from the Diary of St. Faustina <u>Divine Mercy in My Soul:</u>

"I want this image ... to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter; that Sunday is to be the Feast of Mercy ... I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depth of My tender mercy is open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sin and punishment (emphasis added). On that day are open all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet."

I do not know about you, but these words give me much needed consolation. I am convinced of the truth and importance of this devotion for our times and of my duty to proclaim the infinite mercy our Lord has for you. Although we cannot put an act of faith in a private revelation, this private revelation has the full support of the Church and we are more than permitted to practice it, we are encouraged to do so. However, when I speak of the private revelations of this devotion I am speaking of the particular form that was revealed by our Lord to St. Faustina. In general, devotion to the Divine Mercy of Jesus Christ is a moral obligation of our faith. It is no less than being devoted to the fact that Jesus Christ suffered and died to forgive our sins. This must be an object of our faith. The essence of this devotion is to show mercy to others and to Trust in Jesus. Our Lord has revealed outward expressions of this devotion, namely veneration of the image of Divine Mercy, the praying of the Chaplet, and the Novena before the Feast of Divine Mercy. The expressions are attached to the promises our Lord gives regarding this devotion, but they are useless if they are not joined with a sincere repentance, acts of mercy to others, and trust that Jesus will forgive any and all our sins, no mater how evil they may be, if we humbly trust Him in the sacrament of confession. The promises include "the grace of salvation, great progress on the road to Christian perfection, the grace of a happy death, and all other graces and temporal blessings which people who practice mercy will ask Him for with trust." (Jesus, I Trust in You! Selected prayers of Blessed Sister Faustina, 2nd edition, 1995, p. 17)

The Image of Divine Mercy:

The image came from a vision of St. Faustina on Feb. 22, 1931. The image represents the risen Christ. Our Lord explains the image to St. Faustina as follow — "the pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. … I am offering people a vessel … with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. By means of this image I shall be granting many graces to souls; so let every soul have access to it. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over (its) enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I myself will defend it as My own glory." (Divine Mercy in My Soul).

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy:

The chaplet is prayed on ordinary rosary beads and consists of 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Apostles Creed as an introduction. Then on each "Our Father" bead one prays:

Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On each "Hail Mary" bead one prays:

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

One concludes by saying "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world" 3 times.

I am running out of space and time and there is so much more that I want to share with you. To stress the importance of this devotion, I want to quote our Lord one more time from the Diary of St. Faustina:

"Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My mercy. ... Speak to the world about My mercy; let all mankind recognize My unfathomable mercy. It is a sign for the end times; after it will come the day of justice. While there is still time, let them have recourse to the fount of My mercy; let them profit from the Blood and Water which gushed forth for them. Before I come as just Judge, I first open wide the doors of My mercy. He who refuses to pass through the doors of my mercy must pass through the doors of My justice."
