Theology of the Body (Column 29)

Marriage as a Sacrament – a study of Ephesian 5:21-33 cont'd

This whole discussion on the Theology of the Body has revolved around Grace: God's Life/Love and how it is made visible in and through the human body. This series began with an extensive explanation of the meaning of love and how that applies to the Life of the Trinity. I am not going to repeat it here. Rather, let me just summarize it. God's Life is a life of Love between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. God's Life is His Love, God's Love is His Life. Our sharing in this life is called Grace.

For the purpose of this discussion I would like to distinguish between two types of Grace: Actual Grace and Sanctifying Grace.

Before the fall of mankind, through the sin of Adam and Eve, Adam and Eve where filled with Grace. The Holy Spirit dwelt in them. This made them holy, like God, for through the Holy Spirit living in them, they shared in the mystery of the Life of God in the Trinity, in the Life/Love of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We call this Grace sanctifying because it makes the recipient holy, like God. We also call it habitual because it is permanent, it remains or dwells in the recipient. In other words, it is not momentary. This does not mean that it cannot be lost. It can be lost and this is what happened with the sin of Adam and Eve, this Grace was lost in the original sin. It was lost not just for Adam and Eve, but for all of humanity. While this may seem unfair, we must remember that Sanctifying Grace is Divine Life and as humans we do not have a right to it. We have it only as a Divine favor of God to us. It is a privilege and not a right. God had willed that this grace should be transmitted to us through the union of Adam and Eve – in the Body. When Adam and Eve lost this Grace through sin, they could not transmit it through the begetting of Life as originally ordained. In fact, what is inherited is not sanctifying grace but, rather, original sin. Everyone is conceived without sanctifying grace and, without it, is deeply wounded in their humanity.

All grace was not lost. Actual grace is given to all to assist them in life in choosing to do good and avoid evil. It comes to every person for the moment, but if we reject that Grace then that grace is lost to us and we sin. If we do not reject this grace then it works in us the good intended. However, it does not "sanctify" us in the strict sense that we receive Sanctifying grace. Actual grace is not sufficient to get to Heaven. Remember, Heaven is the Beatific Vision of God. The Vision of God whereby we see God as He truly is. We are not simply seeing God with our physical eyes, but rather we are so one with God that we share in His Divine Life/Love between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit fully and perfectly. Sanctifying grace is that life and therefore it is absolutely necessary for salvation. Obviously in this life we do not have the Beatific Vision, even if we have sanctifying grace - neither did Adam and Eve before the fall. While Adam and Eve were full of Grace, the grace was not yet made perfect in them. They had to first manifest in freedom love of God and they could grow in their capacity to share and participate in the love of God. Mary, the Mother of Jesus, was preserved from the stain of original sin and was conceived Full of Grace, however, even she did not behold the beatific vision. She remained without sin through her entire life but she was able to grow in holiness, not in purity as she was from her conception Immaculate, but in her capacity to share and participate in the Life and Love of God. Her Assumption into Heaven was the completion of - and final perfection of the Sanctifying Grace that filled her whole being from the moment of her conception.

Mary, of course, was unique in a singular privilege. We are not so privileged. We begin in original sin. While Jesus Christ has redeemed us and won for us Sanctifying Grace, it must be received and, even then, it is received in our nature, not only deeply wounded by original sin, (original sin is removed, the wounds are not), but also wounded by actual sin. The sacraments are the ordinary means by which Jesus gives us sanctifying grace and an increase in it.
