From The Pastor's Desk

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

What is this feast and why do we celebrate it? The Holy Cross is the instrument by which Christ claimed our salvation. It went from a method of torture and execution for criminals to the symbol of freedom and everlasting life for us. But there is a tradition behind the date chosen to celebrate this beautiful sign of our redemption.

According to tradition, the Cross was hidden by Jewish authorities. Saint Helena through divine intervention decided to attempt to locate the True Cross. When they excavated the spot where the Cross lay, there were three crosses – one was the True Cross and the others belonged to those crucified alongside Jesus. But how to determine which was the True Cross, because the sign that had been hung on the Cross that read *Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudeaorum* (*Jesus of Nazareth*, *King of the Jews*) was removed.

One story says that they took a woman who was sick and near death and had her touch each cross. When she touched the True Cross, she was healed. Still another story states that they brought a dead man and laid him on all three crosses and when he was laid on the True Cross, he was brought back to life. In celebration of the finding of the True Cross, Constantine ordered churches to be constructed at the sight of the Holy Sepulchre. The churches were dedicated on September 13 and 14 in the year 335, hence where the date for this feast comes from.

We see crosses everywhere – in church, in architecture, around people's necks, etc. The Cross is the reminder to all Christians of the sacrifice that Jesus made for our salvation. For in Luke 9:23, Jesus says, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross daily and follow Me." When we take up our cross, we are not only uniting ourselves with Christ but also making sacrifices daily that enable us to be closer to Him. So, on the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross this Monday, September 14, let us remind ourselves of the great sacrifice that our Lord made for our salvation.

"Hail, O cross, consecrated by the body of Christ; his members have made your wood more noble than precious pearls. Through you the world has been saved by the blood of the Lord." Responsory, Liturgy of the Hours.
