#### From Fr. Michael

Happy Easter!!!

Easter greetings and prayers.

We have to accept that life is going to be a series of dyings. It is essentially a dying to self – dying to our pride and ego; dying and letting go of perfectionism; dying and letting go of the need of praise.

We use in our common language "dying to" as a regular part of our vocabulary, "I am dying to sleep, I am dying for some time off, I am dying to get some peace and quiet, I am dying to get away from this person."

This Easter Season the invitation is to say "I am dying to live" and mean it. The Risen Lord is calling us who are baptized to accept our dying, so that we can truly go on living. Because we believe that Christ is risen, we can truly say, we are dying to live. We can be assured of all this because Jesus Christ rose from the dead to save us and to fulfill God's promise of salvation for us.

Dying to live means that we want to share this Good news with everyone we meet.

Dying to live means putting Christ's resurrection into action.

Dying to live means taking care of the poor and the sick.

Dying to live means being a part of a faith community, Christ's Church.

Dying to live means looking at life with hope and cheerfulness.

May the Risen Lord be a living experience to you, pervading every aspect of your life, blessing you, inspiring you and strengthening you in your journey of discipleship. Greatest Comebacks of History

- 5—Mohammad Ali returning from his forced sevenyear exile from boxing, to KO George Foreman in Zaire and reclaim the heavyweight championship.
- 4—John Travolta, reviving his movie career in 1994 by starring in Pulp Fiction.
- 3—Michael Jordan giving up his attempt to play baseball and returning to his first love—basketball.
- 2—among the all-time comebacks was a tie between Japan and Germany, devastated in the Second World War but becoming world economic powers within a generation.

1—named by the editors of Sports Illustrated magazine in the November 12, 2001, issue—the greatest comeback of all time ... Jesus Christ. AD 33. Stuns Romans and defies critics by his resurrection from the grave.

# Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

"This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people, and testify that he is the one appointed by God to judge the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins though his name."

The resurrection accounts of Jesus' appearances, following the empty tomb scene, are familiar and the source of hope and joy. The words of Peter in the sermon from the Acts of the Apostles, brings the meaning of His resurrection to us in 2017. Jesus' redeeming sacrifice earns forgiveness and new life for us today.

Remember, this is the same Peter who shortly before denied knowing the Lord because of fear and intimidation. This sermon of Peter, and others he spoke, as did Paul, summon us to let Easter speak to us today. The Risen Lord offers us the gift of new life, won at Calvary, and generously given if we sincerely turn to Him.

May we let the grace of this day bring the richness of God's grace to us all.
