During the Independence Day celebrations on the fourth of July, you will hear all or part of the poem inscribed on the Statue of Liberty: "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free.... Send these, the homeless tempest-tossed to me."

May we all pause for a moment, cast all our burdens unto the Lord and thank God for the gifts and freedoms we treasure.

A Prayer for Independence Day Father of all nations and ages, we recall the day when our country claimed its place among the family of nations. For what has been achieved we give thanks; for the work that still remains we ask your help. Grant that under your providence our country may share your blessings with all the peoples of the earth. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

A few weeks ago, the Holy Father addressed some young people at a youth rally in Italy. One girl asked him a good question. This is how he responded.

Chiara Parodi's question to the pope

In your Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Gaudium, you invited the whole Church to go out, to be on mission. You challenged us to a mission of "full joy," to take up Jesus' words in John's Gospel (15:11): "These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be full." What advice do you have for us on how to be missionaries to our contemporaries who live in difficult situations of pain and who are victims of drugs, alcohol, violence and the deceit of the Evil One?

Pope Francis' response:

You asked me how to be missionaries to our contemporaries, especially those living in difficult situations, who are victims of drugs, alcohol, violence and the deceit of the Evil One? I believe the first thing is to love them. We can't do anything without love – a gesture of love, a look of love. One can make programs to help them, but without love? And love is to give one's life. Jesus says in John 15:13, "No one has greater love than he who gives his life."

Christ gave us the example; he gave his life. If you don't have a heart willing to love, you won't get far with healing the world. The Lord teaches us to love – without Him, you won't be able to do your mission. The mission is an adventure and you prepare for it by having a heart willing to love.

One of the things I ask sometimes in the confessional is this: "But do you help people? Do you give alms?" Many say yes. (Yes, because people are good, people want to help.) But then I go further and say: "And tell me, when you give alms, do you touch the hand of the person to whom you give alms? Do you look into the eyes of homeless person who asks you for alms or do you pass in a hurry?"

We are all called to love. To really love another is to have the capacity to shake a dirty hand and to look into the eyes of those in a situation of degradation and say: "For me, you are Jesus." And this is the beginning of every mission. Respect the people you serve. If you go out on mission in the name of Jesus but think about those you serve in a negative light – like thinking: "Oh, these stupid people who don't know about religion. I will give them the right stuff. I will teach them how to do things right..." Please! It's better to stay at home and pray a rosary. It will do you more good than to go out on mission with that attitude."

And why must I love these people?... In every one of these persons that are victims of difficult situations, there is the image of God that for different reasons has been mistreated, stricken. There is a story of pain, of wounds that we cannot ignore. Jesus is there, and this means to learn to look with Jesus' eyes, as Jesus looks at people. Look at others as he looks at them. We are all dirty. And if Jesus has saved me, I say: "Thank you, Lord!" Any one of us could be the down-and-out person... If you don't end up being the one addicted to drugs – it's thanks to the Lord. If the Lord had let go of your hand, you and I also (all of us), would end up in the same or a similar place. It is love and grace which we must proclaim.

"Whoever receives you receives me and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me... And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because this little one is a disciple, amen, I say to you he will surely not lose his reward."

One of the gifts Pope Francis extols, is the gift of hospitality. In our families, in our church, we have the ability to open the door and make others feel welcome. A familiar Irish expression reads "A Hundred Thousand Welcome."

Elisha the prophet in the Book of Kings, was offered hospitality by a wealthy woman, and she was rewarded for her gift. The person ready and willing to give ONLY a cup of cold water in the name of Jesus to a little one will not go without a reward.

In the past it was not common to see people carrying a water bottle in public. Sometimes we looked for a fountain for a drink. Maybe the gift of water and hospitality for us can be welcoming a stranger, assisting someone in need, listening to a person who has suffered a loss or suffering a sickness. Whatever gesture I offer can be the Elisha gesture and the water offering which might seem small, but does not go unrewarded.
