

From Fr. Mike

Now that we have invited God into our live with the sign of the cross and set out on a journey to where God is calling us to something big with our response "with your Spirit", we prepare our hearts with a mini examination of conscience. When we respond, "Lord have Mercy", we think of the past week to see where our thoughts lay. Did it rest in jealousy, anger, greed or lust? When we respond, "Christ have Mercy," we look back at our speech. Did we build someone up with our words or did we tear them down? And the hardest part with "Christ have Mercy," what have we failed to? In the Penitential Rite we ask God to see our hearts and embrace them. It shouldn't be about a legalistic infraction of rules or law, but rather God coming to embrace the change in our hearts for being sorry for our thoughts, words, deeds and things we failed to do. It is similar to a parent who looks at their child when they recognize the change of heart after an infraction; not wanting to punish for violation of a law but to hug them to see the conversion taking place.

The Gloria ... where does it come from? "Glory to God in the highest and peace to people of good will" is essentially a Christmas hymn. It is the song the angels sang over a manger in Bethlehem with the birth of the Savior. They are praising God for becoming human and entering into our reality to culminate salvation history. In a sense, every Mass that we sing the Gloria, it should have the same intensity and expectation of the Christmas Midnight Mass. With that same joyful longing, we are getting ready for Jesus to come down on the altar in the appearance of bread and wine. The mystery of Christmas then unfolds before us and is made present again as we sit there with Mary, Joseph and the shepherds.
