Reflections on Africa

The mission trip of Africa was an experience of a lifetime that I was fortunate to be a part of. Going into the trip, I felt nervous and apprehensive as I did not know what to expect. I went in with an open mind ready to experience everything that Kenya and Uganda had to offer. We spent half of our time in Kenya and the other half in Uganda. While we were there, we participated in the ministry by attending daily mass and prayers and helping in the day to day tasks. Some of the tasks included attending to the disabled orphans living at the compound. Interacting with the children brought me joy that I wasn't prepared to experience. The children were excited to be around new visitors and their bright smiles were contagious. Their joy allowed me to see them past their physical and mental disabilities and illnesses and see them as a precious son and daughter of God. During part of our mission, we visited some of the neighbor's homes near the monastery. I saw the poverty that the neighbors lived in as they did not have the basic amenities that we have in America such as plumbing, heating and cooling, and electricity. Despite the rough living conditions, their faith was unshakable. One of the neighbors we met was a single mother of four struggling to go back to school to continue her education. Despite her hardships, she was a faithful woman who expressed hope in God's plan for her. She resonated with a peace that was truly inspiring.

I experienced a joy and peace with the Missionaries of Poor in Kenya and Uganda that I had not felt in a while back at home. In many ways the mission trip was like a retreat for me. I was able to reflect on my faith and focus on my relationship with Jesus. The most difficult part of the mission trip is bringing that joy and peace with me back home. Living out a simple life with the Missionaries of the Poor for two weeks reminded me that strengthening my relationship with Jesus is a start to maintaining that peace and joy that the residents of Africa embodied.

On our recent mission trip to Africa, our group spent two weeks in Kenya and Uganda with the Missionaries of the Poor. Most nights we would gather together for reflection time, where we talked about the day, what happened, expectations we had and if they were met or not. On our last night, Fr. Mike gave us a prompt: what was your "peak" and what was your "pit"?, "peak" meaning the highest moment of the mission, and "pit" being the lowest. Everyone had similar "pit" moments, for example, we shared that we would have liked to spend more time in both locations because we did not have enough time in either. However, I feel like no matter how much time spent on a Mission, it would always feel too short in the end. There was a certain feeling of peace we all felt at both compounds in Kenya and Uganda. The Brothers, the residents, the natives, and even our own group was filled with positivity, openness, and love.

When it came time to share our "peak" moment, none of us could find just one moment that we would consider the highlight or best part of our time spent there. Every moment

was considered the "peak" moment, from visiting and spending time with the residents of both compounds, touring the new facilities for the disabled children, seeing the newly built school for the students in Kenya, feeding and spending quality time with the disabled girls in Uganda. We had the opportunity to visit homes in the community of Kenya, where we met and prayed with women who were sick or have been strong single mothers to their young growing children. A couple of us were able to experience the amazing celebration of Martyr's Day in Uganda, where millions of people from all over Africa walked in commemoration of the 45 martyrs that were killed because of their faith. We also had the pleasure of meeting some young adults that live and study in Uganda, who have a strong connection to their faith and Jesus. It was truly motivating to hear their stories of their pasts, and their visions for their future. We even had the chance to ride on the back on motorcycles that were called "Boda Boda", which my parents were not too happy about. However, every moment of this trip was truly wonderful and unforgettable, and I enjoyed every second of it.

In hind sight, what resonated with me the most, is how confident the people were in trusting God and what His plan is for each of them. I heard many people use the phrases "God's Time" and "God Provides", which did not do much for me at the time. However, looking back and remembering those phrases and how it was said, makes me realize that I am lacking in that area of my faith. I need to strive for the same unwavering trust that my brothers and sisters in Africa have found. Overall, this trip was more than successful. We laid down roots, especially within our hearts, and we all plan to continue to stay in touch with all those we have met, and eventually in "God's Time", we will be able to go back and visit again because "God Provides".

CORPUS CHRISTI



La solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo también se conoce como la solemnidad del Corpus Christi, que se traduce del latín al "Cuerpo de Cristo". Esta fiesta se originó en Francia a mediados del siglo trece y se extendió a toda la Iglesia por el Papa Urbano IV en 1264. Esta fiesta se celebra el jueves siguiente al domingo de la Trinidad o, como en los Estados Unidos, el domingo siguiente a esa fiesta.

Hoy a través de esta Solemnidad honramos la Presencia Real, y apreciamos la Sagrada Eucaristía como un canal de gracia. Para meditar en esta fiesta podríamos centrarnos en un versículo de la Oración Eucarística: "Hagan esto en conmemoración mía". ¿Por qué estas palabras? Porque la última cena de hecho ha sido tan bien recordada a lo largo de los siglos. Jesús no quería que su espíritu de compartir fuera olvidado. No quería que su amor fuera olvidado. No quería que su vida y su sacrificio fueran olvidados. Y en nuestra Eucaristía él es recordado por siempre y hecho presente para nosotros, en formas que nos dan vida. Los faraones hicieron construir gigantescas pirámides a lo largo del Nilo para hacer que sus nombres fueran recordados para siempre. Pero, ¿quién recuerda a esos faraones hoy? Lo que nuestro Señor hizo fue mucho más simple. Tomó dos elementos simples, Pan y Vino, y prometió que siempre que sus amigos se reunieran para una comida con oración, él estaría con ellos. ¡Qué bien ha funcionado!

En los primeros años, los cristianos se reunían en las casas de cada uno para comer el pan y beber el vino, en memoria de Jesucristo. Hoy en día, la Eucaristía se celebra normalmente en la iglesia, utilizando una estructura de conjunto. Pero a pesar de las diferencias rituales, todavía nos reunimos alrededor de la mesa del Señor. Recordamos a Jesús, su compasión, su generosidad, su perdón, sus enseñanzas, sus milagros y su amor. Quería ser recordado así, y aún lo es. Como escribió Pablo, "cada vez que comes este pan y bebes esta copa, proclamas su muerte". Recordamos con gratitud su pasión; pero también estamos contentos de su presencia viva entre nosotros.
