From Fr. Mike

If we were to review the history of covenants throughout the Old Testament, we know that the first covenant that God made with His people was with Noah. God placed a rainbow in the sky to remind Himself that He would never destroy the earth again by water (Genesis 9:8-17). The second covenant that God made was with Abram (later to be known as Abraham) where He promised that Abraham would be the "Father of many nations" (Genesis 17:1-8). The next covenant was made between God and the people of Israel with the Ten Commandments (Exodus 20:4-17). The fourth covenant was made between God and King David and his descendants were established as the royal heirs of the throne of the nation of Israel (2 Samuel 7:12-13). And the final covenant is found in the New Testament in Christ. The death of Christ ushered in a new covenant by which we have the forgiveness of our sins. Christ Himself is the mediator of this covenant between God the Father and His people. It was by Christ's sacrificial death, which served as a pledge or oath, which God made with us to seal this new covenant. Under this new covenant, God would write His Law on the hearts of all mankind. This final covenant accomplished what the old ones could not, which is the forgiveness of sin and the cleansing of our conscience (Hebrews 10:2,22).

The work of Christ on the cross makes the old covenant "obsolete" (Hebrews 8:13) and fulfills the promise of the Prophet Jeremiah. As we begin the faith formation year, it might serve as a reminder to all of us as this same notion and idea of a covenant is used when parents/guardians bring their children to be formed in the faith. As part of their children's acceptance, each parent/guardian must freely sign a "Commitment Covenant" whereby they promise to: 1.) Worship as a family of faith here in their parish of Saint Michael Church. 2.) Promise to bring their children to Faith Formation classes on time and prepared. 3.) To support their parish community to the best of their ability.

As our nature would have it, parents/guardians sign this covenant at the beginning, perhaps without knowing what these promises actually mean or forget about it as the year progresses. The basic elements of the covenant apply to all of us we have in our hearts signed this covenant at the moment of our Baptism. We are a parish family where we recognize that the first and most important aspect of our faith formation is the family's celebration of the Eucharist all year round. This does not mean coming to church only when there are Faith Formation classes. This does not mean attending another parish because the faith formation programs are "easier", while remaining parishioners here at Saint Michael Church.

Canon 518 states that "A parish is territorial. As such, it embraces all the Catholics of a given region or area. This fact, brings with it certain rights and obligations for each parishioner. Canon 857.2 states that "as a rule, a person is supposed to be baptized in his or her own parish. If a person is baptized elsewhere, it will not affect the validity of the baptism, but the same cannot be said about the celebration of a marriage.

Catholics who wish to marry are required to marry in the parish church of one of the spouses (or in the Catholic spouse's parish) if it is a mixed marriage (Canon 1108.1). If they do not obtain permission in advance to marry elsewhere, the marriage is actually illicit! Therefore, we can see from these few examples that "belonging" to a parish is a very important issue.

This notion of parish, of family, is something that we want to instill in our children. This notion of family is what the parish community is striving for. The bottom line of all this and the core of our Catholic faith comes from the Lord Jesus Himself: "Unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood, you do not have life within you" (John 6:53).

PURIFICACION DE LOS VASOS SAGRADOS



Un comentario muy común por muchos que no saben del rito de la purificación de los vasos sagrados, es el decir que el sacerdote

le encanta el vino, es por eso que se espera hasta el final para tomarse el vino que queda en todas las copas después que se reparte la comunión.

Pues en cierto sentido tienen la razón, como todos sabemos la eucaristía es un banquete, el banquete del cordero. Y al igual que en cualquier comida en su casa, los platos deben ser lavados al final de la comida.

Después de la Sagrada Comunión, veras al sacerdote o al diacono limpiando los vasos sagrados que fueron utilizados para la distribución de la Comunión. Esto es hecho parcialmente por razones de sanidad, pero hay un propósito mayor para este ritual. Para nosotros los católicos creemos que el pan y el vino se convierten verdaderamente en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, lo cual es lo máspreciado que hay sobre la tierra.

Por lo tanto, a diferencia de cualquier comida regular en la que se tira a la basura lo que ha quedado de comida o bebidas, en la misa toda partícula pequeña del cuerpo y sangre de Cristo debe ser consumida o reverentemente puesta en el tabernáculo.

Antes de usar el purificador para limpiar los vasos sagrados, el sacerdote o Diacono primero consume la sangre de cristo que ha sido dejada en el cáliz. De igual manera debe fijarse incluso de las más pequeñas partículas del cuerpo de Cristo que pueden haber quedado en la patena o incluso en corporal que esta puesto sobre el altar. Si encuentran alguna partícula debe ser consumida inmediatamente. Después de esto los vasos son limpiados y guardados para la próxima misa.

¿Porque el sacerdote o el diacono siempre se encarga de esta tarea? Si tienes una cena en tu casa, nunca permitirías que los invitados laven los platos. ¿Verdad? ¡Pues un buen Anfitrión siempre se encarga de esto, y en este caso estas e la casa de Dios!
