Dear Parishioners of Saint Michael Parish,

The Parish is holding its second 50/50 Raffle which will be drawn Sun. Dec. 1 at 11:00 am after the 9:30 am Mass. It is a simple way for the Parish to generate funds for the over all improvement of the grounds. Last year the Parish made over nine thousand dollars which we used to put in a new stair case, add new sound system components, fix/replace our air conditioning units and change the lights in the parking lot.

This year we hope to seal the front of the Church to prevent further water damage, repave the Rt. 46 parking lot, and install a new canopy at the front side entrance (currently there is a white awning.) With an eye to the future, upcoming projects include the installation of a church bell, installation of two new stain glass windows (we have two vacant spots in the church), and the renovation of the gym. What is the fundamental movement of this fundraiser? To help each and everyone of us transform our hearts from maintenance mode to mission. So that this parish hears' Jesus' command to go and make disciples of all nations and commit to living it. To see ourselves, and not just the parish staff, as disciple-makers, and strive to coordinate opportunities for people to encounter Jesus Christ and be transformed.

I would ask that each family participate to the best of their ability in our fundraising. There are only three thousand (3,000) tickets printed. The goal this year is to sell all three thousand tickets. You may return the payment and the ticket stubs to the Parish Office. Please make checks payable to Saint Michael Church. The 50/50 Raffle offers three prizes (25%, 15%, and 10% of gross receipts).

If we could have all tickets whether sold or unsold and all monies returned to the parish office by Tuesday, November 26, 2019, it would be greatly appreciated.

From Fr. Henry

EL DOMINGO DÍA DEL SEÑOR / SABBATH

El domingo es el día de la resurrección de Cristo. Los católicos lo celebramos con la Santa Misa y cumplimos con el tercer mandamiento del decálogo (santificar las fiestas).

Desde el tiempo del Nuevo Testamento (tiempos apostólicos), el domingo remplazó al sábado judío como día dedicado al Señor para darle culto y descansar de las labores.

La Iglesia católica no "cambia la Biblia", como dicen algunas sectas que se aferran al sábado como el día de descanso. Es un hecho histórico que desde el siglo I los cristianos celebran el día del Señor el domingo. La Iglesia es fiel a la doctrina de los Apóstoles. Esto es lo que dice la Biblia: "El primer día de la semana, estando nosotros reunidos para la fracción del pan" (Hch. 20,7). El "primer día de la semana" es el domingo.

Con Cristo se inaugura un tiempo nuevo y definitivo. Él es el Alfa y el Omega, y el domingo es el primer día de la semana y el último de la creación. La Sagrada Escritura lo llama y la Iglesia lo proclama: El día del Señor.

La transferencia del día del Señor del sábado, séptimo día, al domingo, día primero de la semana, ocurrió en tiempo de los apóstoles con motivo de la resurrección de Jesucristo. El domingo Cristo resucita, vence la muerte y completa la obra redentora. Si bien el séptimo día (sábado) Dios "descansó" al fin de la creación, el domingo es el día en que todo es re-creado en Jesucristo. Ahora es posible el culto a Dios en espíritu y en verdad.

Ya con el profeta Isaías se predice una nueva creación (Is. 65,17) La nueva creación es la iniciada con la resurrección de Cristo porque él es el primer resucitado de entre los muertos, él es el principio de esa nueva creación (Col 1,18).

Al celebrar el domingo somos fieles a Jesucristo. Él no vino a abolir el Antiguo Testamento sino a darle cumplimiento con su muerte y resurrección. Todo se cumple en Él. Vemos en muchos textos cómo Jesucristo, para dar cumplimiento, presenta la ley antigua en una nueva forma que sorprende a sus oyentes por su novedad y exigencia. La ley queda perfeccionada en Cristo.
