From Fr. Mike

Some have commented that we are not a welcoming parish when they do not get their way. While I recognize the need to grow in hospitality, this is how I look at it. We are welcome to come to heaven, but that does not mean that everyone gets to go there. Why not? Because, “welcoming” does not mean a free ride or an opportunity to do as you please. Just as there are obligations and requirements for getting into heaven, so are there obligations and requirements for being part of our parish family. Being there is number one. Supporting your family by time, talent and treasure is another. But when things do not go your way or when the Law of the Church requires certain things does not mean you are not welcome, but more honestly that you are challenged to be better, to be more involved, to be whole, to be holy.

What “welcoming” means to me can easily be seen when people who have lost their loved ones who have not been “practicing” Catholics during their lives but wish to have a Mass of Christian Burial, they are welcome! It means that no matter what stage or state you are in life, Saint Michael Church, her priests, deacons and her parishioners, welcome you. It means that when you are having difficulty in your lives and need to speak with a priest or go to confession (even if you have not been in decades), you are welcome! It means that if you are down on your luck and are hungry and you need food or clothing, you are welcome to visit our food pantry.

But what it does not mean to me is that when you want to have your wedding in our church and you are not parishioners and only want to rent our church because it is close to your reception venue. It does not mean that when your child is baptized and the Godparents you have chosen have not been baptized or confirmed or are not practicing Catholics. It does not mean you get to pick and choose which church “fits your needs” for Faith Formation because the time is easier and so you decide to join that parish out of convenience. It does not mean you bring your child to Faith Formation classes but do not come to church as a family.

Again “being welcomed” is not a free pass on being conscientious about your faith and your commitment to God and your parish family. When I have to challenge certain individuals about their unacceptable behavior does not mean I am unchristian, unkind, rude or even unwelcoming. What it does mean is that like a good “Father,” I challenge them to be a better person, a better Christian, a better Catholic. Unfortunately, we live in a society that tells us we can be anything, do anything, buy anything and get anything we want, just because we want it. Unfortunately, that is not the Christian way. Our wants should always come second to the needs of others.

As Saint Paul reminds us as he wrote to the early Church living in Philippi: “Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also everyone for those of others” (Philippians 2:3- 4).

Therefore, our desires and wants are not the ultimate test for what is good. And when we do not get what we want, that does not mean someone is not “welcoming” us, maybe they are just challenging us in a Christian way. Many times I have had conversations with people who insist it is “their way or the highway.” Unfortunately, I see the other side of the coin where so many dedicated, honest and hardworking people make the extreme sacrifices for their faith, their children and themselves in order to be part of our family of faith. I have said many times, we are not a perfect family, but we are your family.

My prayer is the same that Jesus prayed to His Heavenly Father: “May they all be one, as You, Father, are in me and I am in You, that they also may be us, that the world may believe You sent me” (John 17:21). I pray for those who are so faithful to our parish family and make difficult and inconvenient sacrifices each and every day for their faith. I also pray for those who have trouble with some “hard” and “difficult sayings” which have challenged their mediocrity, their complacency and their need to get what they want when they want it. I pray that we all one day may be one in the kingdom of peace and light where truly we are “welcomed.” I hope that each of us takes to heart the challenge of being genuine, honest, just, loving, forgiving and humble in the sight of God so that we may be truly welcomed home one day.

Primera Lectura: Exodo 17:8-13

Segunda Lectura: 2 Timoteo 3:14—4:2

El conocimiento de las escrituras y la fé en Jesús llevarán a muchos a la salvación. Pablo incita a Timoteo a seguir predicando el evangelio, a pesar de lo difícil que pueda ser.

Evangelio: San Lucas 18:1-8

Jesús habla de un juez corrupto que no tenía respeto ni por Dios ni por ninguno. Una viuda numerosamente le pidió decidir un caso a su favor. Finalmente lo hizo porque se cansó de escucharla. Jesús indica que si aún este juez corrupto escuchó, Dios, quien es justo, definitivamente escuchará los ruegos de su gente.
