

TITHING – GOD'S PLAN FOR GIVING ST. MICHAEL'S HAS BEEN A TITHING PARISH SINCE 1988.

From Fr. Mike

Someone asked me this past week "Why is the Easter Vigil so long?" To which I asked if they had actually gone to the Easter Vigil Mass and I encouraged them to attend if they haven't been to one. The simple answer to that question is that there is lot in the Mass that we normally don't have on Sunday Masses. First it is the Mass where the culmination of those preparing to have the Sacraments of Initiation takes place so that they can be in full communion with the Church. If there are Catechumens they will be Baptized, Confirmed and receive there first Holy Communion. The Easter Vigil is the proper place for it to take place so the Mass gets extended. For them it is the culmination of many years of prayer and discussion and it should be celebrated with all the proper trimmings. We can make a comparison to a wedding reception, examine the cake cutting and first dance; it is something important to the newlyweds so we should celebrate it with all the "bells and whistles." While there is no cake cutting, the Church wants to highlight the important aspects of Salvation History.

Typically, during a Sunday Mass, the Liturgy of the Word comprises of an Old Testament reading, Responsorial Psalm, New Testament reading and the Gospel. As we get closer to Easter, some of you may have realized that those readings tend to lengthen a bit. In the Easter Vigil there is the option of doing up to nine readings and having a Psalm Response after each of them. The readings highlight the important aspects of Salvation History and how in one evening we can learn about God's action in the world and the formation of the Church. Although nine readings are an option, the minimal requirement is two readings from the Pentateuch (the first five books of the Old Testament) of which the reading from the Book of Exodus is mandatory since the passage over the Red Sea is a prefiguring of Christ releasing us from our sins; the Epistle from Saint Paul, which accentuates of salvation due to grace; and the Gospel. Coincidentally, all of the Gospels for the Vigil leave us with a cliff hanger – the empty tomb. We never get the Hollywood ending where it will be proclaimed that we see Jesus resurrected.

Some of the other aspects that we don't see anytime of the year is that we start Mass in complete darkness and bless the Paschal Candle. The chanting of the Easter Exultet, which is essentially a chant praising the Easter Candle and how this one light, Christ coming into the world to dispel the darkness, takes place. From the one light it gets passed on to every person in the congregation preparing our hearts to sing alleluia in praise.

It is a beautiful liturgy and something worth experiencing. If you never have been to the Easter Vigil, this is an encouragement to attend this year as it is the highlight of our Liturgical Year. Please pray for our two young women in RCIA, Alexandra and Kelly, while not receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation at the Easter Vigil, are in formation to receive the Sacrament on Pentecost Sunday.


