From Deacon Rich

Once you know, you cannot unknow... And, you know... What do you know? You know God and our faith, our religion. You know Jesus, you know God the Father and you know God the Holy Spirit. You know our faith. Knowing it is not enough though... Believing it and living it is what it is all about. Actually, believing it isn't even enough... You can know it and believe it but that is not enough... We have to live it, all the time and maybe that will be enough... Enough for what you ask? Enough to be with Jesus in heaven for all eternity. This is Faith, "F".

The 3 theological virtues Faith, Hope and Charity. They are gifts from God. We have to be open to them and accept them. Faith like Abraham had, that is a gift from God. You have to completely give up control, control of yourself, control of the situation and control of your life. Have you ever done that? When you think about it, we really don't have much control anyway. Have you ever really given everything over to Jesus and say to Him, "you got this" and just stay right there with Him, not trying to control or influence Him, yourself, others or the situation at all? That is Faith, "F". I have done it and it is not comfortable!! I can think of many times lately where I truly said to Jesus," I can't do this anymore. This isnt working... I have no control anyway, it is all yours"... And I gave it to Jesus and just sat there with Him. We are supposed to do this all the time actually. This is how Jesus wants us to live all the time. Don't be afraid. His Will be done, not ours...

Faith is giving up yourself and what you want and giving over to Jesus and, being OK with it all! There are many times where I wanted to give up but gave everything over to Jesus. A lot of the times, it wasn't good things. It is when bad things happen and everything is all crazy. Isn't that how it usually goes though? But, we should always give over to Jesus. Giving up is not good. It is hopeless, without Hope "H". We have to be open to God's gifts. We are Catholic and with Faith "F", we don't have to give up, we can give over. There is a difference, and that difference is Jesus!! Non believers give up, believers give over, over to Jesus.

I remember a time long ago where I wanted to give up but thankfully, through Faith, I gave over to Jesus. I know some of you know this story but way back, when I was in formation to become a deacon... I was young! My hair was black, and there was more of it, it was about 30 or 40 pounds ago and our kids were young (Will 2, Mark 8, Nicole 10) and I had not been in a class room for years. Needless to say, I was worried. And Annemarie and I were brought in for a "special meeting" with the head of the diaconate and the diaconate team. A few deacons and their wives... We were told that they will accept me into the program but they are watching! I was not your typical person in formation. Usually it is men retired, empty house and young grandkids. I was

working, we had a full house and our kids were young. The deaconate team was worried that formation would be too much for me and my family. I was always working, going to class, doing homework and studying. And, they were watching. If they noticed any issues, I was out of formation. I would not be able to be a deacon... It was hard. I was worried about classes and passing. We were in college level classes!

But never mind me, I couldn't have done it without Annemarie. She was doing everything else! All seemed OK and then... Our yearly weekend retreat. Wives had to be there with us. We both had to go. We had little kids home. School, homework, Religious Ed, sports dinner, bedtime. Who was going to watch our kids and take care of our home? Annemarie and I had not been away from our kids much. I was going to give up. Annemarie and I went to see Msgr. Diacheck to see if Annemarie could stay home to be with our kids, just Friday and she would come to the retreat Saturday morning. It was like going to see the great Oz! We were very scared and he made Annemarie and I very upset! He said "NO" to us being excused... Annemarie had to be there for the whole time or I was out. It was bad... But thankfully, through Faith "F", I didn't give up, I gave over to Jesus. I truly said in prayer, "Jesus I give this over to you. If you want me to be a deacon, then you will help us find a way, and if not, I am OK with it". Annemarie's Mom and Dad were able to watch our kids. And Annemarie and I formed a wonderful and loving relationship with Msgr. Diacheck. There were many other times when I thought I was done and wanted to give up... But every time, I gave it over to Jesus... His Will be done. Don't ever give up, give over to Jesus! Faith, "F".

From Deacon John

"Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more." The obligation to get our priorities straight is clearly placed on us with our Gospel today; we are to look beyond the things of this world and to focus on the true treasure that awaits us. One of the difficulties we face with our fallen human nature is that we are very short sighted. We tend not to see beyond the here and now and errors we make today can cause many regrets in the future. The challenge for us in the here and now is to understand where we are is not where we belong. As stewards we have been entrusted with many gifts and talents, and we have the obligation to use them for the building up of the kingdom of God, and not to squander them on worldly "things."

Many people have been seduced by the "Gospel of prosperity" model, where Gods' blessings are measured

by the things you have, and the concept that those blessed in life have the most. In reality, it is not about the things you have, but what you do with the gifts that God has given you. Our mission as Gods' steward is to use the gifts and talents we have been given and we will be held accountable for them at our particular judgment. The Gospel states "for where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." Are our hearts centered on doing God's will, or am I seduced with a "me-first" attitude? Do we recognize the treasure that God has given us? The wonderful thing about divine providence is that God provides for all our needs. The difficulty we face is discerning the difference between want and need. We often get so absorbed in what "I" want that we forget our mission and its final destination. We need to be vigilant in waiting for the master's return, but we also need to do our part while we are waiting here. The goal is heaven but the mission is to bring as many as we can with us and while we are on the way, to share the gifts God has given us with those we encounter and build the Kingdom of God here on earth. I find it amazing that we plan out all the aspects of our life, we plan our future, we plan for our retirement, we have IRA's and 401k's and yet we spend little to no time to consider our where our final destination will be, Heaven or Hell.

It comes down to a question of faith. The letter to the Hebrews gives us the example of what faith is "the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." Many of us have a hard-time understanding the concept of faith without tangible or empirical evidence. Scripture tells us if we have faith the size of a mustard seed we could move mountains. My faith can't be that big, because I have yet to move any mountains, however I do have trust. And by trusting in God and striving to live my life in His will, I understand the great gifts he has entrusted me with. Without faith all in life can seem shallow and superficial, many who have fallen into the secular mindset find no peace or contentment in their lives. We have generations of people who are unhappy, angry, and live unfulfilled lives searching for meaning in their lives. They search everywhere for happiness however they completely ignore the true source, Jesus Christ. We need to set our sights on the bigger picture, happiness is situational, and can disappear as quickly as it came. When we hope and trust in God's love for us we don't have to be concerned with the situational, we have contentment. Contentment is the gift from God that carries you through whatever the world dishes out.

St. Augustine said our hearts are restless until we rest in thee. Our true home is in heaven and we have a choice. We can stumble blindly through life looking for happiness in things, or we can trust in the love and mercy of God, have true faith in Him, and live a life with joy, peace and contentment. The promise is not a life

without hardship; the promise is with God, I can endure all things here on earth, and gain the retirement plan of eternal life in Heaven. We have been entrusted with much, have we used it wisely?

Missionary Cooperation Visit on August 13/14.

Mary Queen of Heaven Missionaries is a religious community based in Cebu, Philippines. Our charism is to peacefully fight the scourge of human trafficking and sexual exploitation through rescuing survivors and rehabilitating them holistically: mind, body, and soul. We are also active in preventing human trafficking and exploitation through our educational assistance in vulnerable communities prone to trafficking, particularly in the rural areas of the Philippines.

We have three rehabilitation centers. *The Home of Love*, a shelter for rehabilitation of human trafficking women and their children survivors, the *My Bonita Home For Girls*, a refuge for the minor female survivors of abuse and the *Regina Coeli Home of Love* in California, a Women's Shelter for survivors of sex trafficking.

Together with our counterpart NGO, *Regina Coeli*, we are able to reach out to many areas vulnerable to trafficking and provide educational assistance to the rural communities to empower and support the students in different Philippine provinces. Our educational assistance program has reached 12,000 high school students across the Philippines as of 2022.

We thank the Pontifical Mission Societies Office in the Diocese of Paterson for giving us the opportunity to do a mission appeal at St Michael Parish Church on August 13-14,2022.
