The Thirteen Folds of "Old Glory"

On this Fourth of July weekend, I want to share with you what is typically seen at a funeral for a veteran that has military honors present. During the military services, you will notice that the honor guard will meticulously fold the American Flag 13 times. While many people think this is to represent the 13 colonies, please consider the following:

1st fold: a symbol of life

2nd fold: symbol of the belief in eternal life 3rd fold: honor and remembrance of all veterans who have given their lives in defense of our country

4th fold: represents our human nature, for as American citizens trusting in God

5th fold: a tribute to our great country

6th fold: where people's hearts lie. It is with their heart that they pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic, for which it stands, one Nation, under God, indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all.

7th fold: a tribute to our Armed Forces, for it is through them that our country and our flag is protected against all her enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

8th fold: a tribute to our loved one who has entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day

9th fold: a tribute to Mothers; for their sacrifice of giving their sons and daughters for the protection of our country.

10th fold: a tribute to Fathers, for they, too have made the same sacrifice

11th fold: the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon which glorifies the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob for our Jewish brothers and sisters

12th fold: represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies God the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit, for those of us who are Christian 13th fold: when the flag is completely folded, the stars are the uppermost reminding them of our nation's motto. "In God We Trust"

After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it takes on the appearance of a triangular shaped hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under General George Washington and the Sailors and Marines who served under Captain John Paul Jones, who were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the Armed Forces of the United States, preserving for them the rights, privileges and freedoms that we enjoy today. May our prayer today be that we may all be truly "One Nation, Under God, With Liberty and Justice For All."

Barrios graduated from Seton Hall University with a master's degree in Systematic Theology and a master's degree in Divinity. In December of 2022, after returning to Seton Hall, Father Barrios received a master's degree in Counseling and Family Therapy and Ed.S. in Professional Counseling.

He has been serving in the Diocese of Paterson as a parochial vicar at Our Lady of Good Counsel in Pompton Plains and St. Philip the Apostle in Clifton. In addition, he served as a chaplain and teacher at DePaul Highschool in Wayne and pastor at Our Lady of Fatima in Highland Lakes. In his spare time, he also served as an adjunct professor for the Core Department at Seton Hall University.

Father Barrios seeks to serve and assist the Saint Michael parish community with a priest's open and caring heart to the best of his ability.

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 2, 2023

"Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me...And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple - amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward."

How frequently in the church we find the word 'receive' to describe important moments. We receive communion and confirmation, we receive absolution and anointing of the sick. It almost seems like a passive moment. Yet Jesus speaks of an action which describes our life, to give only a cup of cold water.

As we give and as we accept, we are drawn closer to the Lord. The reward is God's grace to live with Him. Grace is the life of God, not merited, offered to us as a gift, and accepted. We move from receiving to acting as a true disciple.

In this time when we buy bottled water while others are deprived of good clean water, may we use the message of Jesus to discover how we can give Him to others as a cup of water, as a cup of kindness, as a cup of care and concern. There is definitely a reward.

Muy a menudo en la iglesia encontramos que la palabra 'recibir' describe momentos importantes. Nosostros recibimos la comunión y la confirmación, recibimos absolución y la unción de los enfermos. Pareciera casi un momento pasivo. Sin embargo Jesús habla de una acción que describe nuestra vida, dar un vaso de agua fresca.

Al dar y al recibir nos acercamos más al Señor. La recompenza es la gracia de Dios de vivir con El. La gracia es la vida de Dios, que no nerecemos, ofrecida a nosotros como un don, y aceptada. Tornamos de la acción de recibir, a aquella de actuar como un verdadero discípulo.

En estos tiempos cuando compramos agua embotellada mientras que otros no tienen ni acceso a agua limpia, ojalá utilicemos el mensaje de Jesús para descubrir cómo podemos darle a El a otros, como un vaso de agua, como un vaso de gentileza, como un vaso de cuidado y preocupación. Definitivamente hay una recompensa.
