Deacon Rich - Homily from Aug. 6

Gospel of Matthew 17:1-9 ~ Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. It took place on Mount Tabor in the Holy Land. I was there! I was where Jesus was Transfigured... Along with 30 or so other St Michael parish pilgrims and millions of others throughout all of time... We stood where Jesus stood and showed His Glory to Peter, James and John. Where God the Father said "listen to Him". And where Jesus said "Rise, and do not be afraid". Jesus tells us over and over again, and we hear all through Scripture, do not be afraid... He Loves us so much and in Him we have to trust. Does Jesus tell us what not to be afraid of? Does He clarify? No. He doesn't clarify or expand on the statement, He just says, "do not be afraid"... Period.

I believe we have to be transfigured so to speak, in Jesus, in order for us to not be afraid. We have to become the person Jesus intends us to be... How you ask? With His help and grace... Jesus is always the answer. We have to listen to Him as God the Father tells us... Listen to Him. We have to listen to Him and trust Him with everything, then we will have no reason to be afraid. A way to for us to know how much we trust Jesus is to know how much we are afraid of... If I am always afraid and worried about a lot of things, then I know I have to trust Jesus more... It is an easy way for us to know what we have to pray about too, what we have to listen to Jesus and His will for us about and an easy way to know what we don't have to be afraid of... In other words, if I am worried about a person who is not practicing our faith and not going to Mass. If I am afraid for them and their soul... That is exactly what I need to pray about and then, what I don't need to be afraid of... If I am worried about myself or afraid of something for my family or friend, that is what I pray about and then, what I don't need to be afraid of... It is easy. If we love and trust our Lord Jesus and His Church... Listen to Him and live our life in Christ Jesus and His Church. And His Church is amazing! It is the same Church and same Mass everywhere!

That is amazing too. The Mass is the most beautiful prayer we have on this earth. And no matter where in the world we go it is home. Jesus in the Mass is our forever home here on earth. The Mass is the place

where we go to be transfigured in Jesus... It is the same all over the world. Different languages but the same all over. In the Holy Land, in Italy, here at home and even in Korea! My family and I recently went to Korea to see our son Mark, he is teaching there for a year now and visit our kids birth country. Our 3 children are adopted from Korea.

It was fun, hot and muggy, nice to see Mark, the food was awesome, clean, beautiful... Did I mention the food? We were in Seoul, Busan, we saw museums, stood on the shore of the Pacific ocean... Coffee cafés and many little Mom and Pop shops to eat food. And it was good! Sunday morning rolls around and we look for a church and find St Matthews near Mark's place. It was raining hard, we get on a bus, and it was the wrong bus. We jump off next stop and check... Standing in the pouring rain under our ever-present umbrellas, Willie says we can make it on foot... We start walking, under a highway, along a river, through a park, up some stairs and onto the street... 8 minutes to go at 10:55AM. Mass is at 11:00AM. We pick up the pace... We get to the church at about 11:00AM and go inside... We see a teenage boy and girl and ask... They thought we wanted the English Mass at 1:00PM, we said no, the 11:00AM Korean Mass. The church was big and beautiful, filled with many people. The ushers found us seats, separated because it was full, thankfully, we could see each other. We didn't understand one word! Well, that is not entirely true... I heard "gamsahamnida" which is "thank you". They were thanking God and Jesus. I didn't understand a word and it was one of the most beautiful Masses. Here we are, literally half way around the world, 6,860 miles from Stanhope NJ, soaking wet, sitting next to and with people I didn't know and most likely will never see again here on earth... Not understanding a word but knowing exactly where we were in the Mass and knowing exactly with everyone else, who we were there for... We were all there for Jesus!! A man born 2,000 years ago, Who had something to say to us. And His Father told us to listen to Him.

The cadence, the postures, the "Alleluia", the great "Amen". It was all there, and it was beautiful. We have to be transfigured in Jesus. We have to listen to Him, pray to Him, love Him and trust Him and eventually we will all see Him as He appeared on Mt. Tabor... In all His glory.

Mountaintop moments

We have all had those mountaintop moments. Whether it is the beauty of a sunrise or sunset, or a panoramic view that is just awe inspiring we get a glimpse of the glory of God. There is something about being on top of the mountain that just makes us feel closer to God. Peter, James, and John not only had the view from the mountaintop, they saw Jesus transfigured before them and saw the Glory of God incarnate. Hearing the voice of God the Father from the cloud telling them "This is my beloved son, listen to Him". WOW! They saw, they heard, they felt the fear and awe. Yet, a short time later, when the crowd came to arrest Jesus in the garden, they ran.

This was not what they expected. So many times before Jesus just walked through the crowd. The apostles didn't understand why He would let this happen? It's the same with us. We know Jesus is God. We experience Him and we receive His body and blood regularly. Yet, when tribulation or anxiety confronts us we panic. We worry and we forget who Jesus is, what He has told us, and all He has done for us in the past. The Apostles at least had an excuse for their behavior; they hadn't experienced the resurrection yet. As far as they knew this could be the end for them. We, on the other hand, have seen the results of the resurrection and have two thousand years of proof of the divinity of Jesus, and yet we seem to constantly find something to worry about. Many people, in spite of strong faith, still cling to the desire to have total control over their lives. As they climb towards the top of the mountain, they constantly worry about how they are getting back down and miss the moment.

Sometimes our lives need to crash and burn before we come to the realization that we are not in control, and we need God to carry us out of our messed up life. The difficulty with many of us is that we are not willing to totally give our lives to God. When God asks us to take a leap of faith; we keep checking the G.P.S. to see if there is any other way out. We view the reception of the Eucharist as our minimum daily requirement of God and put Jesus on the back burner to simmer in case we might need Him. God doesn't need that kind of devotion, He wants YOU! How can you expect this life changing encounter on the mountaintop when you can't get your

eyes off your phone? We experience that mountaintop moment when we let God love us. His love is unconditional and unwavering. We, on the other hand, are not always willing to totally trust, and rather than finding God on the mountain with silence, solitude and prayer, we waste our time, efforts and energy with anxiety and worry. Remember, climbing the mountain is not supposed to be easy; it takes hard work and perseverance, just like faith. A life of faith is not always easy but it is always rewarding. If you want to experience God, you have to let Him know, with prayer. We don't grow close to someone unless we talk to them. So, open the eyes of your heart, look for that mountain, and start climbing.

In Luke's account of the Transfiguration, he mentioned that the Apostles were sleeping during most of the conversation between Jesus, Moses, and Elijah. When they became aware of what was happening they became fully awake. Most of us can relate to that as well. God is working wonders all around us and we don't even notice them. Our challenge as we go forward is to open our hearts and our eyes to look for the Glory of God that is right under our nose.

In a few moments will we experience time and eternity coming together on this altar. As ordinary bread and wine become the body and blood, soul and divinity of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. That is our mountaintop moment. So, today as we receive the Eucharist; I ask you to become fully awake from your sleep. Prepare your heart and soul and mind to receive Him, and to experience your own transfiguration.
