World Youth Day 2023

This year, we got the amazing opportunity to travel to Lisbon Portugal to participate in World Youth Day 2023. Our first stop was in Fatima to visit the sanctuary where Mary appeared to three shepherd children and where the Miracle of the Dancing Sun occurred. We got to pray the rosary on our knees, participate in a Marian procession, and pray in the chapel that Our Lady told the children to build. It was amazing to see all of it in person and have the opportunity to pray where such an amazing miracle and apparition occurred with thousands of other Catholic youth.

After our trip to Fatima, we headed back to Lisbon, where the theme of World Youth Day was "Mary arose and went with haste". Through many different catechesis events, and through our pilgrimage out 10 miles to the field where we would be sleeping before Mass with 1.5 million other Catholic youth, we had time to learn and reflect on this theme. Through Mother Mary's example, I learned that we must make haste with all things that involve God. Mary did not delay when she heard that her sister Elizabeth was pregnant, and neither should we with matters involving our faith.

Being able to see millions of Catholic youth together for Mass with Pope Francis put into perspective just how massive and alive in the faith the young Church really is. It gave me a new outlook on my faith seeing everyone around me sleeping in a field just so they could be at Mass with the Pope the next day. Thank you to Father Mike for taking us on this trip and helping develop us in the faith. Finally, I want to say thank you to everybody in the parish for your support and your prayers that allowed me to take this opportunity.

If the idea of 1.5 million people walking shoulder-to-shoulder through the streets of Portugal seems overwhelming, it's because it is. As the temperature continued to rise and the crowded streets narrowed, there seemed to be no end to the cattle-packed procession. There were times where the group was split in two - then three or four. There were times when the vast sea of people felt more like a stagnant pool. Still, with camp-gear in our backpacks and shoes full of aching feet, we kept on.

When we finally met back up to walk as a group, we could begin to see where the path was leading us. From the top of the highway overpass we were treated to the breathtaking sight of Campo Da Graça, covered endlessly with Catholic believers gathered in the spirit of communion and faith. At that moment, we forgot about all the weight on our shoulders and the pain at our feet.

There are times when you experience something so much bigger than yourself that it forces you to take a big step back. Suddenly it feels as if you've been reading the book of your life with your nose in the spine, but now you see that words form sentences that fill entire pages. My experience at World Youth Day has allowed me to better appreciate the constantly unfolding story of my life.

The theme of World Youth Day was "Mary arose and went with haste" because Mary inspires us to follow God without doubt or hesitation. She is a model of how we should serve, be joyous, and merciful. The first night in Faitma we had the opportunity to pray the rosary while walking on my knees, which was terrible especially if you have bad knees. It was painful, but I thought of the suffering Jesus endured during his crucifixion, and how my pain was nothing compared to His. Then I thought of Mary's pain - the pain of loosing a child. I thought it was so pitiful that I was about to tear up because my knees hurt a little (knowing that I would be sleeping on the hotel bed in a few hours). Thinking of my life and how my suffering and sacrifies have been minimal - I had a thought to change my prayers. My normal prayer is: Help my family - Keep them happy, safe, and healthy, even if that means I will have to suffer. But, my prayer is changing from just my family to everyone - the stranger who cut me off on the highway, the friend who is talking behind my back, etc. I realize this prayer is extremely challenging because who in their right mind would want to suffer for people who least deserve it. Not that I WANT to, but because I feel that's what God is asking me to do. I am praying and hoping that Mary will give me the strength and courage to continue on with this prayer. Prior to this pilgrimage, I rarely thought of Mary and her role in my faith. I am grateful to have been on this pilgrimage and

have the opportunity to learn more about her. Thank you to Fr. Mike and all of those who have been supporting us and praying for us - it means so much to be able to go on these "trips".
