Reflections from NCYC



The three days I spent at NCYC are days that I will always keep close to my heart. From the moment I stepped into the stadium I felt a sense of belonging and comfort. Seeing a grand group of teenagers all joined together in worship reminded me that I am not alone in my journey of faith. The workshops I went to all taught me a valuable lesson. One of them, emphasized on the fact that Jesus will always want to heal our wounds no matter what we've done or gone through. This workshop brought me back to what Father Kartje told the youth in the stadium. He told everyone that we are not a "problem to be solved, but a mystery to be encountered." He reminded us that we are God's creation and that we are granted the gift of Eucharist. He told us that all of our pain, grief, and our anxieties don't define us and that we should find our identity in Jesus Christ. I'd like to thank the St. Michael's parish and my parent's hard work because without them I wouldn't have been blessed with the privilege to go to NCYC for the last time. 4th Sunday Advent & Christmas

Undoubtedly there will be many questions about how many times we have to go to Mass this year since Christmas falls on a Monday. The long of the short of it is: TWICE!

Now of course, the next question is why? This may take a little longer to answer; December 24th will be the 4th Sunday of Advent and to ensure that the Advent Season is held in its integrity (which means we actually celebrate four weeks before Christmas) Sunday (December 24th) is technically and liturgically the 4th Sunday of Advent.

Since Christmas is the very next day, that also requires Christians of the Catholic faith to attend Mass on this feast day as well. We have a vigil Mass to anticipate this special event. Therefore, that is why we celebrate a 4:30pm, 10:00pm and 8:00pm (in Spanish) Mass on Sunday evening (which are the vigils of Christmas Mass). They just happen to fall on Sunday. Therefore, if you are not already confused let me try to stir the mud even more: to fulfill your Sunday and Christmas obligation of attending Mass you can choose any regular 4th Sunday of Advent Masses (Saturday, December 23rd at 5:00pm or Sunday or December 24th at 7:00am, 9:30am, 11:30am or 1:30pm). Then to fulfill your obligation of attending Christmas Mass you may choose

7:00am, 9:30am, 11:30am or 1:30pm). Then to fulfill your obligation of attending Christmas Mass you may choose from the 4:30pm, 8:00pm (Spanish) or 10:00pm on December 24th or the 7:00am, 9:30am or 12:00 pm (bilingual) on December 25th. So once again, so you are not confused, you need to come to church TWICE.

If you are complaining about having to come to church twice this year, remember that last year you got a "break" by coming to church only once, because Christmas was on Sunday!

For those who come to Mass each and every week, this really does not make any difference since you are here anyway. And for those who only come to church on Christmas, that does not matter either.

What might matter is whether or not you want to just fulfill your obligations or want to truly worship God and give Him thanks for the many gifts that He has shared with you throughout the year.

If Christmas is that one or two times of the year we see your beautiful face, I gently challenge you to come more often. The crowds are fewer and Mass is not as long. But most importantly, we need your presence and your smile!


