

Change of Address: Please notify the parish office as soon as possible if you have had a change of address.

Inactive Catholics: As a welcoming parish, we ask every parishioner to ask God to put in your heart people whose hearts we need to reach out and touch with God's love. "Before you talk to men about God, you talk to God about men." Please, call, write, leave in an envelope in the collection the name, address and phone number of the person. Father would be delighted to meet with them.

#### SACRAMENTAL LIFE

RCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process to bring non-Catholics into the faith. Anyone seeking information or interested in becoming a part of this community of faith can call the parish office.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are scheduled for the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays of the month following the 9:30 AM Mass. In order to understand and better appreciate this special sacrament, parents are required to attend the Pre-Baptismal Program, which is held on the last Saturday of each month at 7:00 PM in St. Basil's Rectory. Please contact the rectory to schedule your child's baptism.

**Sacrament of Marriage**: Couples contemplating marriage should notify the rectory at least six months prior to the date to allow necessary time for proper preparation.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Urgent calls will be attended to at any time of the day or night.

Visitation of the Sick: Please call the parish for visitation of the sick at home, in the hospital, or health care facility.

#### Reflection

The First Reading is from the Book of Genesis (12:1-4a). God promises Abram a great blessing.

The Responsorial Psalm (33:4-5, 18-20, 22) God's mercy is upon those who trust in God.

The Second Reading is from the second Letter of St. Paul to Timothy (1:8b-10). Through God's grace we are called to holiness.

The Gospel Reading is from the Gospel of Matthew (17:1-9). Psychology has taught us a great deal about family dynamics and how we have come to be the person we find ourselves to be. We are comprised of such a mixed bag of blessings and obstacles with their graced moments and sinful ones. Think back on the journey of your life and how the many different and varied choices that you made influenced the direction your life. If you didn't go on that first date with your spouse, who would be beside you today? If you chose to be in one place rather than another, what would have happened to the course your life has taken? We are on such a wonderful, exciting journey. What is most incredible and awesome is that we are not alone! God is with us. He inspires, heals, opens doors, and calls us every moment of our lives. The very life we have is due only to Him.

We can all sit down and list adjectives describing who we are. One may find him or herself more artistic than another or quicker with wit. We have unique gifts and talents and have the great gift of free will, which we treasure. Our histories come with more baggage for some and less hurdles for others, but we all have to find our way through the path we are on. However, have you ever given much thought to who you *really* are? That question has more merit than may at first appear.

We know ourselves as we live out our earthly journey. But do we know our heavenly self? What we know here is only one small part of who God has made us to be. The disciples really thought they knew Jesus until they went up the mountain. We also may think we know our true selves, too. #### The Light Is On For You

One of the greatest opportunities given by the Church to assist us in our response to the Lord's invitation to conversion is found in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Once again, the Diocese of Scranton is participating in "The Light Is On for You." Beginning on the first Monday of Lent, March 2, and continuing through Monday of the last full week of Lent, March 30, confessions will be heard in St. Francis of Assisi Church in Mildred from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

#### The Disciplines of Lent

The season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 26<sup>th</sup>. Traditionally, Lent has been marked by three disciplines. The first of these is prayer. We will all be encouraged to try our best at setting aside more time for prayer than we are accustomed to doing. We are encouraged to journey into the Lenten desert through meditation, reflection, and contemplation.

The second discipline is fasting and abstinence. Those between the ages of 18 and 60 are obligated to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together do not equal to a full meal. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. Abstinence is an obligation for the faithful (especially those from age 14 and above) to refrain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and the Fridays of Lent. In addition, many people will abstain from desserts,

The third discipline of Lent is almsgiving and works of charity. This reminds us that Lent is primarily a season of doing and through a deeper awareness of the concerns of those around us, particularly the poor and the needy, we may more closely conform our lives to Christ.
