



A Note from St. Joseph's Finance Committee

Dear Parishioners of St. Joseph's,

Thank you for your time, treasure and talents as faithful stewards this past year. The following is a summarization of information supplied to us by the Archdiocesan Accounting Office. As you can see from the financial report, God has blessed our parish again this year. Our parish closed the year with a positive balance of \$184,129. This amount does not include the restricted funds from our Athletic Association, Home and School (HIVE), Marketing, Prayer Shawl Ministry, Quilters, Respect Life, Women of Mary, and our Endowment Fund.

Points of Interest

- We currently have \$353,715.97 in our reserve funds (our savings).
- We currently have \$8,034.30 in the Building and Maintenance account which is restricted for Parish Capital improvements. This restricted account comes from various funds from estates designated to this account.
- We have \$61,011.31 in our future Building Fund. \$18,868.54 of these funds are pledges that were restricted by parishioners to the church expansion fund only and not to the parish center.
- We have \$17,659.50 in our Parish Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund. It is a blessing that we have been able to maintain our two cemeteries the past fourteen years from the funds from the annual offertory envelopes and the sale of lots and have not had to tap into the perpetual care funds again this year.
- We have \$684,039.99 in our Parish and School Endowment Fund and \$2,210,572.42 in our Parish and School Non-Endowed Fund, these include gifts from the Velma Lober and William Young estates. These accounts have fluctuated due to stock market changes. Due to Archdiocesan guidelines, funds from any parish/school endowment can only be withdrawn once a year in January. These funds are then budgeted for the following fiscal year. These guidelines help in preparing a more actual budget for the parish and school. This past year, there were not any earnings on these accounts.
- The amount of subsidy needed from our weekly Sunday collections to sustain our school this past fiscal year was \$213,374. This means that 30.35% of our weekly contributions go towards maintaining a Catholic school. This is known as our "parish subsidy".

Our **budgeted** parish income has again been helped by the Lenten Fish Fries which brought an additional \$32,734.09 the annual School Dinner Auction which brought in additional revenue of **\$75,676.28** the Mouse Races **\$9,172.56** and the Parish Picnic netted **\$24,655.55**.

We thank you, the parish community of St. Joseph's, for entrusting your faith in us to oversee the gifts you have faithfully given to God and our parish.


