These efforts would provide opportunities for mothers experiencing unplanned pregnancies to bond with their unborn babies and encourage them to carry their babies to term. Catholic Belief Spotlight:

What is the meaning and purpose of the red candle next to the Tabernacle?

- In the Old Testament, God told Moses that a lamp filled with "clear oil of crushed olives" should perpetually burn in the Tabernacle (Ex 27:20-21). This is the precedent for the Catholic Church's custom of burning a candle (at all times) before the tabernacle – the gold house where the Eucharistic Body of Christ is reserved.
- Our Catechism (CCC 1182) states that:
 - the tabernacle is to be situated "in churches, in a most worthy place, with the greatest honor."
 - It should foster adoration before the Lord, who is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the altar.
- On Good Friday, the Blessed Sacrament is removed from the altar so the red candle is not lit. You don't need to genuflect.
