The Catholic Church invites each of us to deepen our relationship with the Lord, to be formed in truth, and to live out our baptismal call with conviction and joy. Learning and embracing the richness of the Catholic faith helps us grow in love for God, for others, and for the Church.

Through prayer, study, and community, you will have the opportunity to:

- Learn about the Catholic Church's teachings, beliefs, and traditions
- · Reflect on Sacred Scripture and how God is working in your life
 - Deepen your relationship with Christ
- Prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist)
- Be equipped to live as a missionary disciple in the world

We are inspired by the words from the Gospel of John when two disciples ask Jesus, "Rabbi, where are you staying?" and Jesus responds, "Come and see." (John 1:38-39)

This is Christ's invitation to each of us—to come. see, and follow Him. Our parish OCIA sessions will begin on Wednesday, September 10, from 6:30 to 8:00 PM, and continue weekly until May 20.

The Gift of the Anointing of the Sick

"Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the priests of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord." – James 5:14

The Anointing of the Sick is one of the most beautiful and consoling sacraments of the Church. It is a powerful encounter with Christ for those facing serious illness, undergoing surgery, struggling with chronic conditions, or nearing the end of life. Through sacred prayer and anointing with blessed oil, the person receives spiritual strength, peace, and often even physical healing, in the embrace of God's mercy.

A Sacrament of Healing and Hope

Too often, the Anointing of the Sick is thought of only as "last rites." But this sacrament is not only for the dying—it is meant for any Catholic who is seriously ill in body, mind, or spirit. It brings hope, forgiveness of sins, and the courage to suffer in union with Christ.

Receiving the sacrament in time—before a medical crisis or unconsciousness—allows the person to be fully present and spiritually open to its grace.

When Should Someone Be Anointed?

You or your loved one may receive Anointing of the Sick:

- · Before surgery or a medical procedure
- During serious illness or physical decline
- If diagnosed with a life-threatening condition
 - As the end of life approaches

Catholic Belief Spotlight:



In his book, "The Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist," (copy available in the Adoration book bin) Father Robert DeGrandis tells us that we can gain more from Holy Communion by wearing the "eyeglasses of faith." He advises us not to see the priest or the Eucharistic minister giving us Communion, but to form an image of Jesus giving you Himself.

Fr. DeGrandis says that Jesus is giving you His body and blood for your healing. Jesus' love is pouring forth and He is blessing us in abundance. We usually don't feel this, but it is happening. He likens it to entering a room filled with uranium. We might not feel the radiation upon us, but it is affecting us powerfully.

After Holy Communion, do we return to our seats and watch the line of parishioners who are going up to receive Jesus? Fr. DeGrandis says, "If Catholics really comprehend who it is they are receiving and believe that Jesus the healer has just come into their hearts, I don't think they would be looking around the church or fumbling with bulletins or hymnals. This is one of the greatest moments for healing. I think they would be using this time for prayer and thanksgiving."
