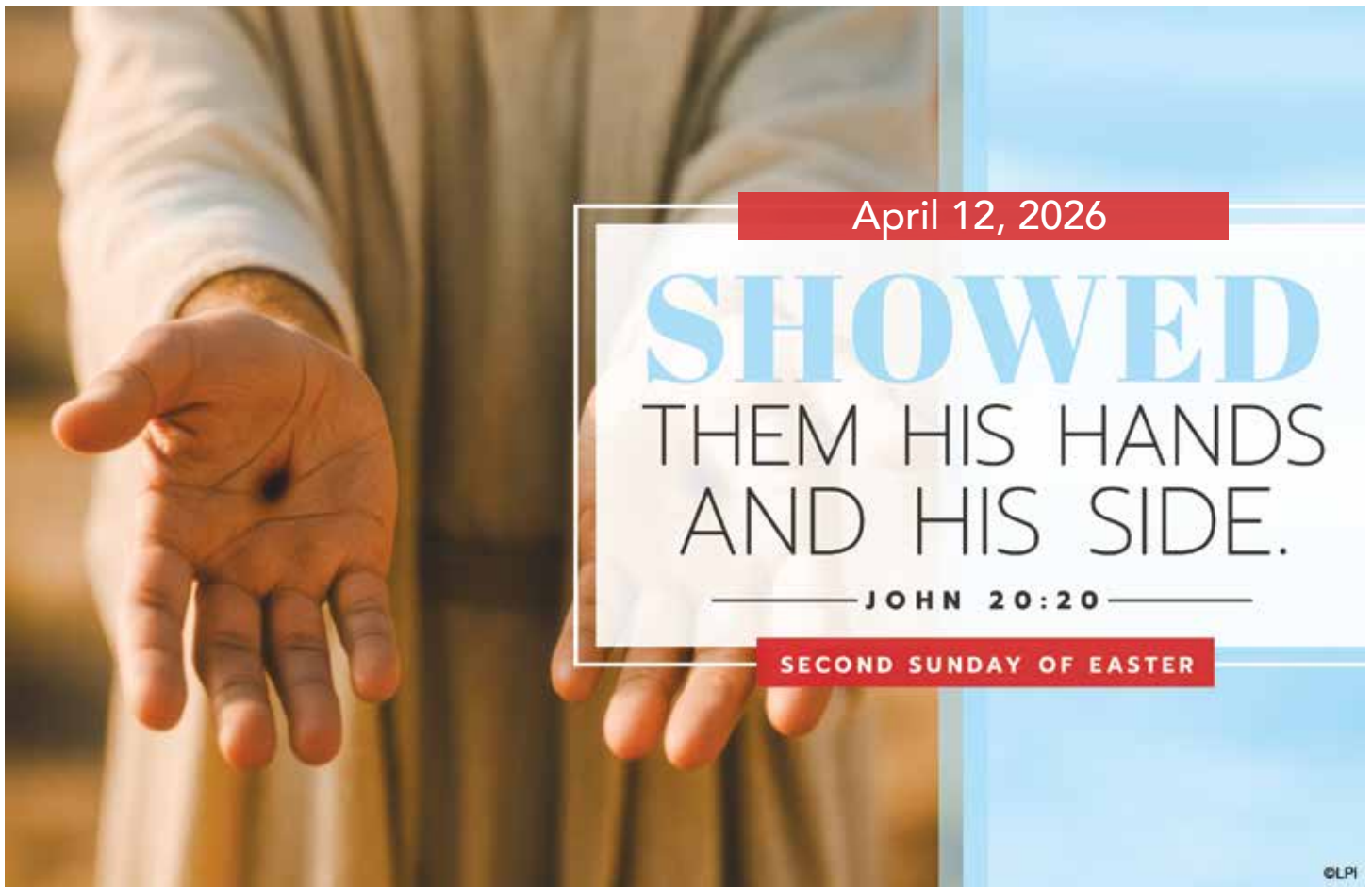

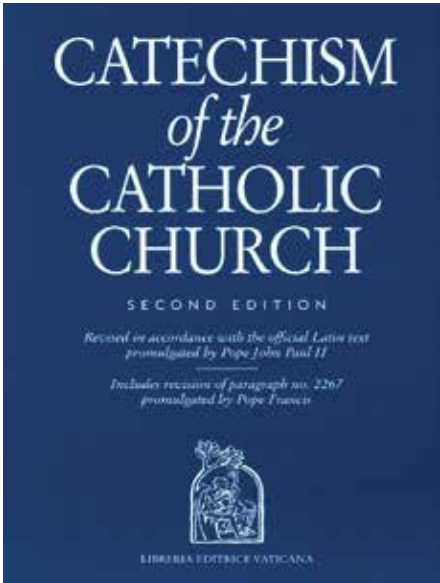

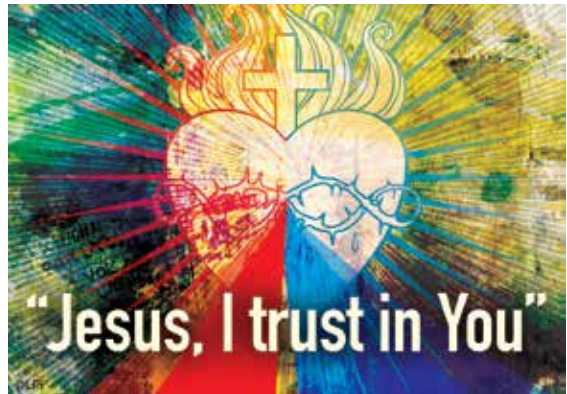

## A Note from Fr. Gerson



On this Second Sunday of Easter, as we conclude the Easter Octave, the Church invites us to continue contemplating with joy the great mystery of the Resurrection. During these eight days we have celebrated as if it were a single day, allowing the Holy Spirit to help us understand more deeply the immense love of God manifested in Jesus Christ.

By the will of Saint John Paul II, today we also celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. This celebration is not just another devotion, but a central truth of our faith: God, moved by His love as Father, looks upon our fragility and our failures with a heart full of compassion. Divine Mercy is God's loving response to our weakness. Jesus Christ, who died and rose again for us, is the greatest proof of that love which never abandons us and always seeks to save.

The Lord gave His life so that we might live, and by rising again He opened the doors of salvation for us. Through faith and conversion, each one of us can approach this inexhaustible source of mercy. The Church, as a mother who cares for her children, reminds us of the importance of approaching the sacraments, especially during this Easter season: participating in the Eucharist and reconciling with God through confession. There we find forgiveness, peace, and the strength to live as true disciples of the Risen Lord.

Today, as the parish community of Saint Joseph, we want to give thanks to God for the children who have received Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time: Alistair, Maria, Christy, Stacy, Daniel, Tristan, Jonathan, Lorelai, Kingston, Chase, Giovanni, Sophia, and Harlan. We joyfully congratulate each one of them on this very important step in their life of faith. May this first sacramental encounter with Jesus be the beginning of a deep and lasting friendship with Him.

We also express our sincere gratitude to the catechists who, with patience, dedication, and love, have accompanied these children in their preparation. Your commitment is a valuable witness of service and dedication to the mission of the Church.

Likewise, we congratulate the parents, whose example and testimony of faith support the spiritual journey of their children. Thank you for your effort, perseverance, and for keeping the faith alive in your homes.

May during this Easter season all of us renew our trust in Divine Mercy and approach with sincere hearts the sources of grace that the Lord has given us. The Risen Jesus counts on each one of us to bring His love and mercy to others.

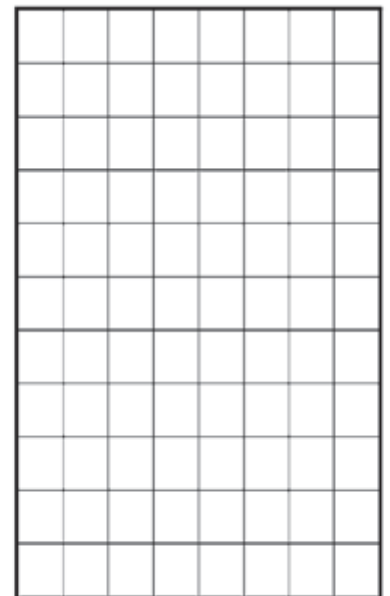

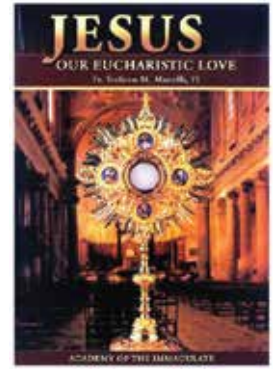

**Catholic Belief Spotlight**  
**GOD IS LOVE** In his book, “*JESUS Our Eucharistic Love*” Fr. Stefano M. Manelli, implores us to understand that the Eucharist is a “gift of a God who is Love and who gives Himself to us as a Gift full of Love.” We have all heard the phrase, “God is Love,” but do we really understand what that means to our soul?



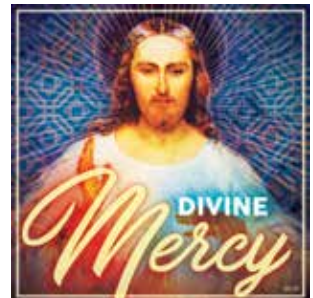
St. Thomas Aquinas wrote: “The Eucharist is the Sacrament of Love. It signifies Love, It produces Love.” St. Peter Eymard declares: “The Eucharist is the supreme proof of the love of Jesus. After this, there is nothing more but Heaven itself.” **Fr. Manelli asks, “How many of us Christians do not know the vast extent of the love contained in the Eucharist?”**

St. Catherine of Siena often said to her confessor: “Father, I am hungry for the love of God. Give this soul her food, her Lord in the Eucharist.” She also **confided**: “When I am not able to receive my Lord, I go into the Church, and there I look at Him...I look at Him again...and this satisfies me.”

When St. Colette was asked why her eyes were always lowered in modesty, she said, “I have filled my eyes with Jesus, upon whom I have gazed at the elevation of the Host at Holy Mass, and I do not wish to replace Him with another image.”

**Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?**

If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.



Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young woman, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, “a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come.”
