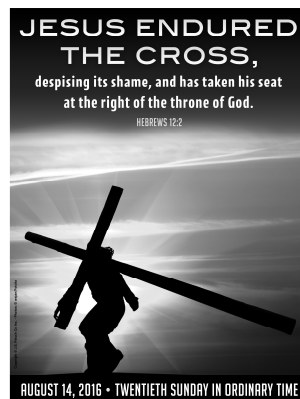
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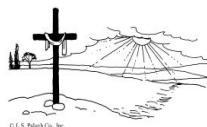
The Costs of Discipleship

Today's responsorial psalm, Psalm 40, is more familiar to us with the refrain "Here am I, Lord." This "Here am I" is Jeremiah's great prophetic response to God's call. But today's story of Jeremiah and the refrain "Lord, come to my aid!" remind us that there are always two sides to following the call of God. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews knew this, too. He reminded his readers that even weighted down with burdens and sins, we can still persevere by keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, who himself knew the shame and pain of the cross, but saw beyond it to the joy of sitting at the right of the throne of God.

Jesus himself gave the disciples a "sneak preview" of a baptism that would not be as wondrous as the one in the Jordan that inaugurated his ministry, but would be one of fire and anguish. Today's words from scripture may not be terribly soothing, but in their honesty and strength we can acknowledge the difficulties of daily discipleship, and take comfort in the assurance of our own salvation in Christ.

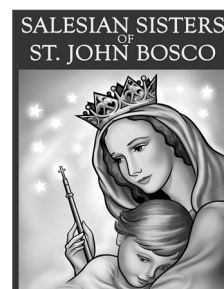
SALESIAN SISTERS MISSION APPEAL

As part of the Diocesan Mission Cooperative Plan, a Salesian Sister of St. John Bosco will speak at our Parish on the weekend of **August 20-21, 2016** on behalf of their foreign mission ministries. They will be asking for your help in support of their works throughout the world.

The Salesian Sisters are a worldwide Community counting nearly 14,000 Sisters spreading the Gospel on every Continent. Approximately 6,000 Sisters work in mission areas affected by great poverty, disease, political unrest, violence, war and other difficult conditions, such as, areas of natural disaster and refugee camps.

The Salesian Sisters were founded by St. John Bosco in 1872 and started their mission work in 1877 when they departed from Italy for the farthest tip of South America called Patagonia and Tierra del Fuego. Ever since then, they have continued to provide missionaries for Africa, Asia, Latin America and other places not yet evangelized or in need of re-evangelization.

Their Congregation was specifically founded for the service of poor youth; consequently, most of their ministries will have an educational thrust. They are grateful for the opportunity of sharing their mission work here at Notre Dame of Mt. Carmel and of benefiting from your generosity.

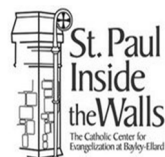


SAVE THE DATE: WOMEN'S CORNERSTONE XVII

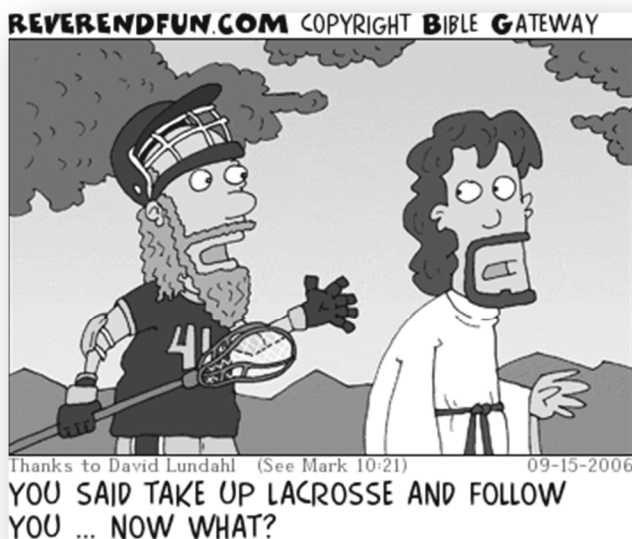

WHAT'S THE HOLY SPIRIT?

It's the spark. It's the spark of the Church. It's the spark that shines in the depths of your soul. It's the spark that makes you do amazing things, like move mountains. It's the spark that lights up the world. And guess what, it's got an everlasting burn. To form a better understanding of how the Holy Spirit can change and empower our actions, I thought of a new concept, based in ancient credence, that is: spontaneity of the Holy Spirit. Spontaneous derives from the Latin term "spona" which means to act of your free will and to act fast. There's something about being spontaneous that makes a person feel so out of control and so in control at the same time. I think of when I play tennis and rush up to the net for a volley. The tennis ball flies at me so quickly that there's no time to think, instinct takes over, and then I make my best shots. The world needs more people stepping up to the net. You've got to be fast. You've got to be fierce. Remember the Pentecost when the apostles received the gifts of the Spirit – did they wait around in the attic, testing out their gifts, analyzing what might come of it? No! They immediately went out and began to witness. Sure, it took a few (fifty!) days for them to get their heads in the game. But once the Holy Spirit was upon them, they were spontaneous! They spoke in tongues! They prophesied! They went for it.



When was the last time you just went for it?

Maybe it's time for you to change jobs, join a prayer group, start a community service project, or proclaim the truth in foreign tongues... but you'll never know if you never act on it. Don't hide in the attic. Don't cower on the sidelines. This is your life! Step up, seize the power offered to us by the Holy Spirit, and set the world on fire with your faith!
