
Renewal through the Lens of Marriage Ministry

Middle School Faith Formation: Welcome!

Last week our Middle School families with children in 6th and 7th grade began their journey for this school year. We have a total of 55 children and 11 faith leaders in sessions meeting Tuesday or Wednesday evenings.

To offer the children a sense of welcome and belonging, we had a series of games and icebreakers.

Here, the Children and faith leaders are playing a Family Bingo game in which everyone had to find others in the room whose families fill a description in each of the boxes. Some of the descriptions were religious in nature, such as "prays at home together" or "has had a priest over for dinner."



We also played a beach ball activity, in which we stood in a large circle and threw a beach ball with questions on it around to each other. As people caught the ball, they had to read and answer a question on the ball, i.e., "Describe a time you sensed God's presence" "Describe a memory that always makes you laugh."



The participants then resumed sitting in their small table groups and interviewed each other in pairs, asking the questions: What club/sports do you participate in? What is your favorite thing to do to have fun? What was the best thing you did this summer? Also, they were asked to find one thing that they have in common with each other. Then each interviewer introduced the interviewee to the rest of the table. The small groups also took time to discuss what they hope to learn over the course of the year together.



At this first session, we also distributed the Breakthrough Youth Bibles that will be used in the lessons again this year. Here is Fr. Alex blessing the Bibles before the session.



We are looking forward to a wonderful year of growing in faith and community with our Middle School children and their parents. Stay tuned for a special feature on our Confirmation Preparation journey!
