

Eight groups were launched, offering varied themes and formats. Here is what some of these leaders have to say about their particular journeys:

The program gives us many insights into the rituals of the Mass and addresses why we do and say what we do during the various parts of our Sunday Gathering. Beth Letizia, who led the *Life is Messy, but there is CPR for the Soul* journey shared: "Many participants agreed that this theme seemed relevant for them now more than ever, and they were grateful that this series was in-person. Here are some of their takeaways:

- "The in-person discussions were part of the CPR for the soul."
- "We learned to cherish today and every moment."
- "Being imperfect is ok."
- "Most of all, there is hope in the light of God."

Laura Balogh, who is co-leading *Bishop Barron's Pivotal Players* series with Marge Collins, shared: "The journey this fall has been very inspiring! We meet virtually, which is helpful for those who work or are not in the local area. We have enjoyed exploring the different personalities who have made a significant impact on the Catholic world, who came

from different walks of life and had diverse talents: St. Augustine, the 20th-century author Flannery O'Connor, and legendary creator of the Sistine Chapel, Michelangelo. The group discussions have been lively and have even inspired some to dig deeper into these "players." Some of our participants are returning members from the previous offerings of Pivotal Players in past seasons. We have one more session to go and are already talking about offering another series this Lent!

Young Adult Christa Cottone chose as the theme for her group, *Who Am I to Judge? Responding to Relativism* with Logic and Love:

"We have completed the first half of this FORMED series, which centered on the classical, or Catholic, view of morality, and now we are learning how to address moral relativism. This theme has proven relevant in today's age—the secular world has distorted how each person achieves and experiences happiness.



We meet in person, and our sessions have become like conversations in a living room, featuring serious anecdotes and musings, but laughter, too. We may be of different ages, backgrounds, and marital statuses, but we all long to implement and share insights from this journey." Christa Cottone




