
Subject: Parish Update: May 17, 2021



Spring Leadership Summit

This past Saturday morning, over 70 parish leaders came together for the first time since the pandemic struck without warning in March 2020. These committed disciples represented nearly all of our parish ministries, and it was a special joy to welcome new leaders into the fold for such a milestone event.



Most participants attended in person, and the morning began with breakfast and joyful fellowship in the Parish Hall. The theme of the Leadership Summit – "Reconnecting in Hope" – was on vivid display as ministers exchanged hugs, laughter, and brief snippets about the past year's journey of separation.





After a welcome and opening prayer by Father Paddy, participants listened to personal testimony from 3 parish leaders who shared their struggles and joys during these challenging months. Following their powerful witness, Summit participants

(both in-person and virtual) engaged in small group discussion about what they had heard and about the impact of the pandemic on their own lives and ministries. A representative from each discussion group briefly summarized a key takeaway from their group's conversation.









As our gathering wound down, Father Paddy shared with these "essential workers" in the vineyard insights about how we, as a parish in renewal, are structured based upon a model that is not the traditional top-down approach, but on a bottom-up, servant leadership model. Also shared was what has been created as a roadmap or pathway for discipleship at Notre Dame.



"Everyone has been profoundly impacted by the pandemic. Their faith and the support of Notre Dame in so many ways helped many people to cope. We need to

continue to offer support and comfort as well as the opportunity for people to share their feelings. Our community at ND is powerful in helping others to heal."

"To be together in person was a joy. Although I have been fulfilled and engaged throughout the pandemic with the numerous virtual offerings, it was wonderful to be together again, life and in person."

"The summit was very beneficial in jump-starting my re-engagement with onsite church participation."

"For me (the Summit) affirmed the importance of our Notre Dame community, not only in my life but in the lives of everyone I spoke to and heard speak at the gathering."

"The Summit reminded us that there is a lot of grief to process. Some ministries are open to returning to a hybrid of in-person and virtual, and I liked Fr. Paddy saying that we can use technology to minister beyond our parish and the local area."



We give all thanks to the Holy Spirit for our dedicated, faith-filled leaders, without whom very little would be possible, and for this opportunity to reconnect and look toward a hopeful, ever more vibrant future as a faith community!


