
Ukraine Relief:

n Tuesday, March 15, the Middle School Faith Formation families gathered in the church to hear an inspiring witness talk from fellow parishioners Emma Vales and her father, Jack. Emma has a strong passion for the dignity of the human person, from conception to natural death, and

Emma has a strong desire to serve others and has many interests and hobbies. She has been an active participant in the Girls Scouts since kindergarten. At Villa Walsh, she is a member of the service club St. Lucy's Angels/Life Witness. Part of



the club's mission is visiting and corresponding with the Sisters living in the Infirmary who are isolated





She enjoys participating as a witness in Mock Trial, an organization in which high school students simulate real-life trials.

The Belonging Project – Finding your Tribe and Learning to Thrive: "When I found this book several months ago, I knew I had to do a Discipleship Group with it. I also knew this would be a perfect study to lead in my home. Boy, was I right! Welcoming these 11 women into my home these past two weeks has been so rewarding. This study is designed to help us build relationships, find



our Tribe, love our God while reading some of the "one another" sayings in the New Testament: Love one another, serve one another, Build-up and strengthen one another, Forgive one another. Did you know there are 52 instances of "one another" in the New Testament? One for each day of the year.

"Our first week was a session for fellowship and getting to know "one another." We shared about our families, our faith journeys, and our friends. We left that evening with full bellies and our "homework" for the next week. When the ladies came back for the second week, they were genuinely happy to see each other and chat before it was time to dive into the video and our homework. We laughed watching the video, which is full of "mom humor." The discussions were incredibly fruitful; I can feel the bond we all have already. I am looking forward to the next three weeks and beyond to see where this Tribe of women goes from here."

Everyone's Way of the Cross: "Last Thursday, our Discipleship Group held its third session, where we travel with Jesus as He takes the final journey to His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. She is now undergoing a period of Purification and Enlightenment, a time during Lent of more intense spiritual preparation and introspection. This period is marked by three celebrations known as Scrutinies. During the First Scrutiny this past Sunday, Tricia and her godparent, Claire Matlon, were called up to the Sanctuary. First, Tricia knelt, and there was a period of silent prayer. Next, the assembly prayed for Tricia in the following Intercessions for the Elect. Fr. Paddy then prayed



that she might reject everything in her life that is contrary to Christ. The Second and Third Scrutinies will take place on the next two Sundays, March 27 and April 3, at the 11:30 am Masses. Tricia and the other candidates (Allie Ferenc, Michael Nemeth, Felicia Apito, and Gianna Korpita) seeking the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation will continue on their journey of preparation.

No Chocolate, Know Chocolate! Third Sunday of Lent

The "No Chocolate, Know Chocolate" message was shared this past Sunday by Deacon Joe at our 9:30 Family Mass. He showed a cacao pod and explained that within it, there are lots of seeds (not beans!). The cacao seeds can be planted to produce more cacao trees or used to make chocolate. As Deacon Joe explained, we as Christians are just like cacao pods and seeds; who we are on the outside is not important, but who we are on the inside is. When we have Jesus' love on the inside we can reproduce that love to share with others!

- The hosted team members need a roof over their heads and shower access. Each person has their own sleeping bag and mat, pillow, towel, and toiletries, so floors, couches, or air mattresses work just fine!

Consecration of Russia and Ukraine

A message from Bishop Kevin Sweeney

"On March 25, 2022, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, will consecrate Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. As the Holy Father seeks the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary for peace and an end to bloodshed, we all join in prayer with him in imploring God for the gift of peace in Ukraine. On March 25, 2022, I will celebrate a Bilingual Mass in the Cathedral of Saint John the Baptist at 12:00 Noon which will be livestreamed.



"I invite all parishes of our local church of Paterson to join with the Holy Father in prayer on March 25th (at 12 noon, if possible) for this Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart.

As we watch the unfolding of the horror of families torn apart by war and innocents trampled by the hideous weapons of war, we pray that the Blessed Virgin Mary, under the title of her Immaculate Heart, will through her maternal intercession, bring peace and healing to the suffering."

At the 12 Noon Mass this Friday, our parish will join in prayer as our Holy Father consecrates Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
