On Tuesday, March 1st, Divine Renovation hosted an impactful conversation via Zoom with *Bishop Robert Barron* (Word on Fire), *Father James Mallon* (Divine Renovation), and *Rev. Nicky Gumbel* (Alpha). Thousands from over 80 countries joined the webinar, including our staff and several of our parish leaders. The conversation focused on "What is God saying to the Church," in terms of our mission of evangelization, in light of the continuing impact of the pandemic and most recently, the war and crisis in Ukraine.



These key presenters and leaders each offered a particular focus on critical aspects of our mission: the essentiality of educating ourselves in matters of our faith, the vital need to care for and renew our communal (parish) approach to evangelization, and the primacy of inviting the Holy Spirit into our mission -- to guide us as individuals, in our Church communities, and united as the Body of Christ.

Rite of Election on Sunday, March 6, 2022

As you heard before, we have a group of five faith-filled individuals on a spiritual journey in our OCIA (formerly called RCIA) Program. On February 20, at 11:30 a.m. Mass, **Tricia Yeung**, born in the Buddhist faith and seeking all three Sacraments of Initiation, including Baptism, was introduced to the parish in the formal Rite of Acceptance.


