

SS LifeTeen Shipped Off to Arizona

Sullivan, Ann McLoughlin, and Anthony Tortorello attended the annual Catholic Youth Ministry Convention (CYMC) in Arizona. (Unfortunately, it wasn't feasible for Q to participate due to a previous commitment to lead worship at Catholic Heart Workcamp in TN.) Below, Fr. Alex shares some thoughts about their experience.



"Unless you are new to the parish, you know we are all about becoming

missionary disciples. That belief encourages us to equip ministers with the tools to be leaders, and that is what CYMC does. This was the first time for our core members; they attended a beginners track, where they could review the basics of how we host Life Nights, the term used for youth meetings on Sundays

following our 6 pm Mass. While they came prepared from their one-year experience here at the parish, they learned many new skills to reach out to the teens..."

"We had wonderful presentations from psychologists and counselors to better understand the effects of social media and the

pandemic on teenagers... We were blessed to have the presence of some wonderful priests who shared the witness and struggle of

some challenging teens and challenging moments in their ministry. I was particularly impacted by the story of Fr. Louis Merosne from Haiti, who took a parish no one wanted and transformed it into a thriving community by always placing his trust in Jesus and never being afraid to go out and share the faith in the community. He is a true example of living Pope Francis' call to be a 'field hospital' Church."

"Whether it was the daily Mass or powerful moments of Adoration, Christ in the sacrament of the Eucharist was truly present to us all. But there were some amazing moments of praise and worship as well, led by the amazing worship leader Sarah Kroger."

"Yet the most important part of any CYMC is not just living the event and returning to the same old as before. Every authentic encounter with Christ calls us to change and move forward. Myself and the rest of the team at CYMC are encouraged to go out and find the teens where they are. It will not always be easy, and it can be tempting to turn back and give up when the rain might fall on our journey, but we have committed ourselves to Christ. Here at Notre Dame, our youth ministry is ready to face the challenges and share a love that is without equal, the love of Jesus Christ." Fr. Alex
