
This past weekend, the Family Faith Formation Team sponsored the Vatican International Exhibit, **the Eucharistic Miracles of the World**, presenting some of the principal 152 Eucharistic Miracles that took place throughout the centuries in various countries of the world.



We offer special thanks to Diane Striegel from Our Lady of Mt. Carmel in Boonton, NJ, who handles all of these materials and loans the exhibit to different parishes.

The exhibit's designer was **Blessed Carlo Acutis**, the Italian teenager
(and first Millennial!) on the road to
Sainthood, who was fascinated with
Eucharistic miracles and technology.
Bl. Carlo developed a website
cataloging these miracles before his
untimely death of leukemia at the age
of 15 in 2006. He was beatified by
Pope Francis in 2020.



The topic is especially relevant given the 3-year Eucharistic Revival underway in the Church. Unfortunately, according to a Pew Research study, only one-third of U.S. Catholics (31%) say they believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Sacrament.





A relic of Blessed Carlo was also on display for veneration.





Eucharistic miracles are extraordinary events where the Eucharist no longer appears in the form of bread and wine but takes on the biological qualities of human flesh or blood or both. Most Eucharistic miracles involve incidences in which the Blessed Sacrament has transformed into human flesh and blood. Of course, as Catholics, we believe that the consecrated Host we receive each Sunday at Mass is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord, under the appearances of bread and wine. Therefore, Jesus, through these miracles, merely manifests His Presence in a more tangible way.





At the Family Mass and Contemporary Mass, Fr. Alex introduced the children and teens to Blessed Carlo and the meaning of relics in our Catholic faith.

"Many of the children stretched their necks to get a better look at the strands of hair in its special container. It was amazing to see this special exhibition of Miracles of the Eucharist through the wonder and curiosity of innocent children." Ann Bono

"My children really enjoyed the exhibit, although as we walked around reading, Braeden wanted to read about the miracle of Peter walking on water. My friend, who is from Mexico and was at Mass with us, explained to my kids (and her grandson) that she had been to Guadalupe and told them about that particular miracle. A journey of faith is exactly as the statement says, a journey. We go on an adventure of encounter and discovery. Sometimes our story will have lulls, but there are those mountain tops that enable us to get but a glimpse of the destination and reinvigorate our hearts and souls for the many challenges ahead of us. In such a way, I was strengthened this past week by an opportunity to join over 150 brother priests from around the United States at a four-day conference at the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology in Austin



When we think about the formation of priests, the first part that comes to mind is often the seminary. And this is an intense part of any priest's formation, but it is in ongoing formation that priests *rekindle the gift received at ordination*. Some of the greatest agents of this ongoing formation are yourselves.

They opened up scripture in new ways that I have not experienced since seminary. More so, scripture revealed itself to me under a new light of living out New Evangelization here at Notre Dame. But most importantly, I was graced to see, with the heart of a child of God, our Lord Jesus Christ alive in His word, seated next to our Queen Mother Mary and glorified most magnificently in the Eucharist.

Oneness: A Journey for Married Couples





Lenten Discipleship Groups: Survey Says...

In the past few weeks, we have heard testimonials from some of our leaders and participants in the Lenten Discipleship Group journey. Today we share key insights gathered via a quick and anonymous survey administered to the participants of 17 of the 19 Discipleship Groups (two of the groups, which are scripture-based journeys, are still underway).

- Of the 143 participants, 79 responded to the survey yielding a **55% response** rate.
- Of those who responded, **18% were first-time participants** in a Discipleship Group here at ND.

Participants were also offered the opportunity to share comments about their experience; 62 of the 79 respondents (78%) shared their thoughts, reflecting consistency with the above assessments (i.e., overwhelmingly positive and affirming). Below are just a few:

"The leader did a fantastic job of guiding our journey. She helped us open our hearts to the Holy Spirit in order to see deeply what is happening around us."

"I wasn't familiar with the topic, so this was eye-opening. It showed me much about where I came from in relating to God & others. It also gave me insights into where others in my life might be coming from. This was all presented in a forgiving way and showed God's love for all of us!"

"Group leader excellent. Struck the perfect balance between offering relevant and meaningful input while encouraging others to do the same." "I loved my group! I am sad that tonight is the last night. I grew so much in my prayer life. It was exactly what I needed to deepen my spiritual growth."

"How beautiful to be made aware that we are responding to Jesus' personal invitation to Mass to encounter Him in Eucharist."

"I was so surprised by how clutter and all our extra "stuff" related to our spirituality and the presence of God in our lives. We prayed, shared, and enjoyed laughter as we journeyed together. Patty was awesome! She created a peaceful, comfortable environment and prayerfully guided our discussion. I was blessed to be in this group!"

Discipleship Groups are vital to the path of Evangelization and Faith Formation (catechesis) in our parish. The variety of themes offered -- season after season, year after year -- have provided countless participants with opportunities to belong and grow in their faith and relationship with Christ and one another. At the same time, these small groups have offered excellent opportunities to raise new leaders, as participants feel called to lead a group or are invited to consider leading a journey! 
