He was 18 years old when he was shot through the neck and wounded by shrapnel after he was shot. He was captured by the Germans in Saint-Malo, France, and eventually exchanged for a German prisoner. Awarded the Purple Heart, Bronze Star, two campaign stars for Normandy and Northern France, Combat Infantry Badge, Good Conduct, WWII Victory medal, Morris County Distinguished Service medal, and the Legion of Honor, bestowed by the French Government." #### A Journey to the Permanent Diaconate

Eight years ago, I started having thoughts of becoming a deacon, and three years later, I began formation. And now, in just a few weeks, Bishop Kevin will ordain nine other men and me as Permanent Deacons in the Paterson Diocese. While this was a decision made by God, with the support of my wife, Debby, I have willingly and lovingly submitted my will to his invitation into diaconal ministry.



On May 13<sup>th</sup>, Bishop Kevin met with our cohort to share his joy and excitement about our upcoming graduation and ordination. Bishop Kevin took us on a journey through his calling to the priesthood, his ordination, and what it was like when he was asked to be the Shepard of the Paterson Diocese. Throughout our time, his passion for the Bible, his love for the priesthood, and his profound commitment to our Lord were nothing less than infectious. In addition, our group used this opportunity to present the Bishop with a portrait of Mary and Jesus as an expression of our gratitude.



On that morning, as I stood at the altar in the chapel of St. Paul Inside the Walls, I also signed my Oath of Fidelity and Profession of Faith. Perhaps most importantly, at that moment, I knew in my heart and soul that it was God's will for me to be a deacon!



During these years of preparation, I have been drawn more deeply to service, liturgy, and the Word. My desire to evangelize and help those in need is greater than ever. And my marriage has developed a more significant spiritual intimacy than during any of the 32 years we have been married.





Back in October of 2021, I launched the first Discipleship Quad at Notre Dame. Three other parishioners and I met for at least 90 minutes every week for an entire year, discussing Scripture and Tradition and growing closer to Christ and to each other. We journeyed through all four seasons, finishing in October of 2022. As we reported in a series of four witness videos at that time, it was an incredibly rewarding experience for all four of us. What's happened since then, you may be wondering.



I formed my second quad in December of 2022, breaking the unisex rule by inviting the three amazing women from my fall Alpha @ Home team. Today we're halfway through!



**Diana Thomas** says that "being a part of my quad has brought me a deep sense of belonging. It's a beautiful and unique opportunity to listen to how different our thoughts and feelings are about our faith, yet we are all on this journey." **Helen Krisiewicz** concurs and adds: "Being in this Discipleship Quad has inspired me to be more committed to my time of worship and the Sacraments. Meeting in a group each week with three others committed to learning about and discussing their faith has been a blessing." **Maureen Crystal**, who works full time, had to carefully consider joining the quad: "I decided that I needed to prioritize my time and life and decided to join the quad. It is a gift to be able to share thoughts and ask questions of people; I do feel like I am becoming a better person and Catholic due to the quad."

In February of this year, original quad member **Pat Madden** formed another quad, which is now over a quarter of the way in.



As Pat mentions, "I was looking to lead others to the spiritually expanding program I had just experienced. The beauty of having four men participating in these events is that each of us brings his life experience and philosophy to the program." Joe Orrecchio says, "The quad has certainly led to a deepening of my faith. I am more consistently filtering my thoughts, decisions, and actions through a faith-based lens. I leave with a renewed sense of commitment to my faith and ready to take action." Dan Bozza shared, "I felt the Holy Spirit had been nudging me for some time now to become more active in my faith. The Quad experience has helped me focus more on God in my daily life."

Original quad member **Matt Cooney** didn't have the time to start his own quad, but his story is perhaps the most inspiring. During that first men's quad, Matt decided to pursue a theology degree from Franciscan University, the university which supplied the material we use for the quad. "After 25 years in business, I felt the call to give back and plant seeds. The quad inspired me to get my Master's degree and pursue a career teaching High School Theology." Congratulations, Matt!

Finally, in April of this year, the first women's quad finished its journey. Although it was not feasible for one of their members to complete the series, the experience bore much fruit in the lives of this quad's participants.



**Patty Migliore-Torres** says, "I loved it! It's like having my own personal community to grow in and share my faith." And **Kathy Bogwald** told me, "The journey has made a huge difference in my life. God is my center; everything else in life revolves around that wonderfully fulfilling relationship. I am no longer intimidated by reading the Bible; it is now my life journey guidebook, providing all that is needed to have a life of faith, love, mercy, hope, and peace."

#### **Diving Deeper Into God's Word... Together**

During Lent, we began a beautiful deep dive into James, the book of Wisdom in The New Testament.

James has only five chapters, but it is full of beautiful "pearls of wisdom" for tough times and in relationships. He addresses the disconnect between faith and action, reminding us to be doers of the Word, not just hearers -- our faith should lead us to love and to good works. Wisdom is known through speech, so it is important to be patient in suffering, to control the tongue, to refrain from judging, etc. James's words reminded us to live according to the principles of the Kingdom of God within an often-hostile culture. We learned about the importance of godly wisdom, humility, patience, and fortitude (gifts of the Holy Spirit), the beauty of works, and the wisdom of Confession and prayer.

During our 11-week Bible study journey, we read Scripture faithfully week after week and gained beautiful insights. The discussion questions called for deep introspection; we did our homework and looked forward to the group sharing!



It has been a joy leading this Bible study Discipleship Group, bringing people together to learn the Word of God and to belong, connect, inspire, and encourage

one another. Special thanks to Cristina for suggesting James; we were amazed and marveled at the depth of the beauty and wisdom of this letter.

We feel truly blessed to learn Scripture and grow in our faith and our love for the Lord. God willing, we hope to strengthen our faith journey by participating in many more Bible studies together.

### **Family Faith: Pathways Pilot Update**

We in the Family Faith Formation
Team wanted to provide an update
about our exciting *Pathways* pilot,
an initiative intended to build up and
strengthen the Domestic
Church. This pilot has been
underway during this Formation year
with thirteen dedicated families with
children of varying ages and
sacramental paths.

Pathways, produced by a Catholic priest and his team at Faith and Family Life Catholic Ministries, is a suite of home-based materials in an appealing box format, providing everything a family needs to have faith-based engaging discussions at home, in the form of "scripted" family meetings. Each family meeting contains a theme, prayer, a fun activity, and a catechetical teaching around our faith.



Throughout this formation year, the pilot families experienced family meetings at home and also gathered here at the church for monthly check-ins with our leaders. The main goal of our pilot was to guide and accompany these families through the formation year to determine if the *Pathways* approach is the right fit for our parish culture in a broader sense.











The overall feedback from the families participating in the pilot has been positive. Parents appreciated the freedom to choose their own convenient times, and the children enjoyed the novelty of opening the box each time to discover new activities and props. One participant said the resources do a good job of scripting out the material to follow and are ideal for people's busy schedules (has found a "sweet spot" of meeting people where they are). They also reported an appreciation for simply spending time together as a family. Some parents perceived the parent formation materials as too lengthy and too catechetical. All feedback received is being carefully assessed for future adjustments that will make the program more manageable and fruitful in the lives of our families.



As a result of this feedback, we have decided to utilize *Pathways* for certain segments of our Family Faith Formation program this coming Fall. We will announce dates over the summer to share about these upcoming changes and provide all the families with further details. Stay tuned!


