



Walking Together in Faith: The Journey of Confirmation Formation

"Confirmation deepens our baptismal life that calls us to be missionary witnesses of Jesus Christ in our families, neighborhoods, society, and the world."

(United States Catholic Catechism for Adults)

We are so grateful to have begun another inspiring year of faith formation for our Confirmation families! On Sunday, October 5, we welcomed about 40 teens and their families to **Confirmation Level 1** for the first of four parish sessions in the 2025–2026 formation year. Our Confirmation preparation process is designed to help both parents and teens encounter Christ more deeply and grow as missionary disciples.





Using *Faith & Family Catholic Life Ministries' Pathways Wonder* resources, Level 1 families explore the parables of Jesus through storytelling, hands-on activities, and meaningful conversations at home. Each of the ten Family Meetings focuses on a different parable, helping participants uncover its moral message and apply it to

their daily lives. Throughout the year, families come together for four in-church





Then, on Sunday, October 19, our **Confirmation Level 2** teens and parents gathered for their first meeting of the year, marking an important step on their two-year journey toward receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation in May 2026.



Meanwhile, Level 2 teens and parents focus on deepening their understanding of the sacrament itself and the call to live as witnesses of Christ. The formation process, based on the Pflaum Gospel Weeklies, emphasizes regular participation at Sunday Mass, service to



Their first session on October 19th included an introduction to the year's expectations and an invitation from a member of the Youth Ministry Core Team to consider continuing their involvement in parish life after Confirmation.

Ultimately, the goal of both years of Confirmation formation is to nurture a genuine and lasting relationship with Jesus Christ—one that inspires our teens and families to live their faith joyfully and courageously. Please continue to pray for all our Confirmation families,

"Angelo and I found the parent session this past Sunday to be a truly meaningful experience. Matt (Faith Leader) was amazing—he engaged us thoughtfully, helped us revisit our own Confirmation journeys, and guided us through a powerful reflection on the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. It was so insightful and motivating to be led by someone who actually "lives" within the Holy Spirit, and not just someone who is volunteering to do a good deed.

We're hopeful that this year will help Tomaso grow not only in knowledge of the faith, but in confidence and personal connection to the sacrament—so that when the time comes, he'll feel truly ready to embrace it with intention and happiness. For most of us on parent night, there was an overwhelming consensus that our own Confirmation experiences felt rushed, dutiful, and more like a requirement than a meaningful milestone (many of us could barely recall the moment itself). This year, we're especially hopeful that Tomaso's journey will be more spiritually enriching, giving him the space to understand, connect with, and truly embrace the sacrament in a way that stays with him and something he relives and relishes in 10, 20, 30, or even 40 years (as in my case) later." - Marisa Pecoraro

Generous Hearts of Notre Dame Answering God's Call in Unexpected Ways

Our beautiful new monstrance was brought to our sacred space through the still voice of our Lord in a parishioner's heart. While the donor wishes to remain anonymous, below is the story behind their generous gift.

"There are moments in my life when I'm called to action, requiring that I offer myself more fully. I had been in deep contemplation, meditation, and prayer, discerning my personal attributes and how to use them to serve others. Initially, I felt drawn to volunteer in the Holy Land, helping Palestinian refugees in need. However, when that didn't work out, I redirected my focus, trusting that God would reveal His plan.

Then it happened that the place closest to my heart at Notre Dame — the St.

Benedict Chapel — was being renewed as part of our Centennial. It became clear that my calling lay there. As I reflected on my passions, I realized that my love for Eucharistic Adoration and spending time in silent prayer in our chapel were now my focus points for action and the answers to my prayers for direction. I was moved to reach out to Fr. Vidal and offer the new monstrance for our Lord.

I am grateful to have listened to God's call and to respond to His plan. As Scripture notes, "He speaks to us in a small, still voice" (1 Kings 19:11-13). May we be still, listen, and be ready to be amazed by how God wants to use us."



The Bible Timeline: A Journey for All Seasons

The Bible is the greatest love story ever told. In 2022, I had the joy of leading *The Bible Timeline Study*, and daily reading and meditating on God's Word became a source of beauty, power, and healing in my life. The Living Word has drawn me ever closer to Christ and His Church. In this Jubilee Year of Hope, I felt called to offer the study again, trusting God to bring together those He desired for the journey, and He did.

In May, a small group of disciples began studying salvation history from Genesis to Jesus over 23 sessions. Together, we deepened our faith, shared personal insights, and discovered how God's plan of sheer goodness continues to unfold in our own lives.



We gave thanks for the gift of the Church, the Sacraments, and the fellowship we shared. *The Bible Timeline Study* has been a profound blessing, a time to grow in knowledge, friendship, and unity as brothers and sisters in Christ, truly living the promise that "All things work together for good for those who love Him" (Romans 8:28).



"The first day of the Bible Timeline study was the same day I found out I was pregnant with my second child, only a few months after losing my first at 4 weeks. It felt providential. Like God was giving me a sign of new life and new beginnings, but it wasn't the kind of providence I expected. Two weeks later, I miscarried again.

After my first loss, I tried to take control on my own, but it only left me exhausted and far from God's peace. At my breaking point, my only prayer was, "God, please, just hold me." And He did. Through the Bible study, I began to hear His voice in Scripture and learned that His story—and mine—is one of surrender, trust, and redemption. I discovered that faith means trusting His timing even when it doesn't make sense and finding peace in letting go of my own plans. I've come to know God's heart more deeply and to believe that what He desires for my life is far more loving and beautiful than anything I could have imagined. I still struggle with fear and impatience, wanting answers in my own time, but I've learned to surrender those thoughts to God and trust that His plans are greater than mine.

Through the Bible study, I also came to know God not just as an idea, but as a loving Father who is personal, patient, and always near. Scripture helped me see the bigger picture—His plan for the world and for my own life—and taught me that every story of waiting, loss, and redemption reveals the same truth: God never leaves His people.

I'm deeply grateful to God for leading me to Notre Dame of Mount Carmel and to our Bible Timeline study. Growing in faith within such a loving community has been a true blessing. I'm especially thankful to our instructor, Tanya D'Souza, whose wisdom and love for Scripture have been a guiding light on this journey." Molly Monteleone

Research supports the idea that parish or education-based Vocation Ministry is crucial. Studies show that the majority of young men consider a religious vocation between the ages of 6 and 18.




