

"On Friday, December 5th, I had the pleasure of attending the Food Rescue Christmas Party for the first time since I started working here at Notre Dame two years ago. My intention was to stay for a few minutes and then go home, but as I started chatting with the people at my table and felt so welcome, I decided to stay; I was one of the last people to leave!



That night, I went home with a heart full of joy, gratitude, and admiration for the hard, meaningful work of the Food Rescue ministry's leaders and volunteers. I had the opportunity to meet many of them I didn't know before, and I was impressed by the number of generous souls who contribute to this beautiful work of rescuing food to feed those most in need.

I heard some heartwarming stories, including the wonderful work Carlos does in Paterson, where he helps many people in need. It was also very moving to hear the story of the Plaid House, where they help young teenage girls during a vulnerable time in their lives. It was wonderful to hear about the difference a meal prepared with love by a generous person can make in their lives.













So, how did I end up involved in this ministry? A few months into my work at this wonderful church, a Food Rescue Ministry leader asked if I wanted to take a couple of bags of bagels to my home parish, Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Orange, NJ. I told her that, unfortunately, we didn't have a food pantry, but that Our Lady of the Valley parish in Orange, NJ did, and that I would ask the pastor if they accepted bagel donations. I spoke with the pastor as soon as I could, and he said they would gladly accept the bagels. The following Friday, I told the ministry leader I would bring the bagels to Our Lady of the Valley!

During my most recent delivery this past weekend, one of the volunteers told me that this weekly donation has been a great blessing and that, unfortunately, the food pantry is at risk of closing due to a lack of donations. This has motivated me to continue doing my part to keep it open. There are many people in need of food in the Orange area, and I feel it is my duty to answer the call Jesus gave us to feed the hungry.







I am immensely grateful to the Food Rescue Ministry for their great work and their generous hearts. The Christmas party was a very beautiful and inspiring experience where I enjoyed a delicious meal, the company of generous people, Christmas carols, and even a surprise gift!"

"The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." (Luke 10:2)






In the stillness of Eucharistic Adoration, we ask the Lord to stir hearts, grant courage to those He is calling, and guide our Church with faithful and joyful servants.






