




While the initiative is ending, our parish continues to need your gifts of time, talent, and treasure. Your discernment and decision to support our parish mission at any time are an impactful blessing!

Post Confirmation Celebration!



One Step Closer Through Divine Mercy



On Tuesday, June 17, 2025, at our monthly One Step Closer, parishioner and theology teacher Matt Cooney presented *Divine Mercy: The Second Greatest Story Ever Told*. The Divine Mercy message and devotion have been called the largest grassroots movement in the Catholic Church's history.



During his talk, Matt explored the origins of the Divine Mercy through the visions and diary of Polish nun and mystic St. Faustina Kowalska and why this devotion is important to our faith. Matt also shared that when Saint Pope John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina on April 30, 2000, he surprised the entire world by establishing Divine Mercy Sunday as a feast day for the entire Church. We celebrate this day on the Second Sunday of the Easter season.

The message of Divine Mercy is simple: God loves us all, and He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins. Thus, we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy. We can call the message to mind simply by remembering the ABCs: *A* - *Ask for His Mercy; B - Be merciful to others; C - Completely trust in God's mercy.*



Matt also explained the Divine Mercy image, which reflects how Jesus appeared to St Faustina: one hand raised, the other hand opening his garment, and two rays of light emanating from his breast, representing the risen Christ whose hands and feet bear the marks of the Crucifixion. The pale ray stands for the Water, which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood. These two rays signify the sacraments of mercy (Baptism and Reconciliation) and the Eucharist.

"When I heard that the next One Step Closer series would focus on Divine Mercy, I felt a deep tug to be there—and I'm so thankful I followed that urge. The presentation, subtitled "The Second Greatest Story Ever Told," was not just a talk—it was a powerful journey, beautifully guided by Matt. Matt shared the life of St. Faustina and her extraordinary encounters with our Lord, unfolding the profound and beautiful message of Divine Mercy. What made it even more impactful was how he gently wove in the lives of St. Maximilian Kolbe, St. John Paul II, and even Rudolf Höss, illuminating how grace can pierce even the darkest corners of history. Matt's thoughtful storytelling and deep knowledge of the subject touched me and brought a new dimension to my understanding of Divine Mercy. I'm truly grateful I was able to attend." Maria Cascio










Mass Transit Conversations


