NOTRE DAME OF MT. CARMEL FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

Dear Parishioners,

On behalf of Fr. Vidal and our Finance Ministry, I am pleased to share with you our Annual Financial Report for the fiscal year from July 1, 2024, to **June 30, 2025.** As you will see, our Fiscal Year-End results reflect the positive impact of your generosity through the **Faith in the Present**, **Hope for the Future Offertory** program launched in late May of this year.

- In contrast to the declining Offertory Collections we had reported in our previous update, **our Fiscal Year-End Offertory Revenue reflects a generous increase in the weekly donations along with one-time gifts, commencing in May 2025**. The overall giving increased by over 28% in May and June compared to our average monthly giving in the previous ten-month period for our fiscal year.
- The increase in Giving and the resulting improved financial performance over the last four months (March June) contributed to a reduction in our net operating deficit from the previously reported (\$62K) for the 8-month results, to (\$12K) for the Fiscal Year-End. (A)
- Additionally, during the twelve months ending June 30, 2025, while the parish incurred \$70,347 in Capital Expenditures, we also received \$118,531 in grants for exterior lighting and roof/HVAC replacement payments, allowing us to recover \$48,184 back to our Capital Reserve Fund. (B)

Our Finance Ministry is currently working with our Parish staff, along with input from the Diocese of Paterson, to finalize our 2025/2026 Annual Operating Budget, which will be shared this month.

While our recent financials offer a deep sense of gratitude and hope, we continue to face financial challenges, not only in eliminating our deficit but also in addressing the needs of our aging facilities. It is more important than ever for our parish community to come together — with **faith**, **hope**, **and action** — to support the short and long-term strategies that will sustain our mission and ministry for the next 100 years and beyond.

We are grateful for your continued prayers, generosity, and dedication to our parish.

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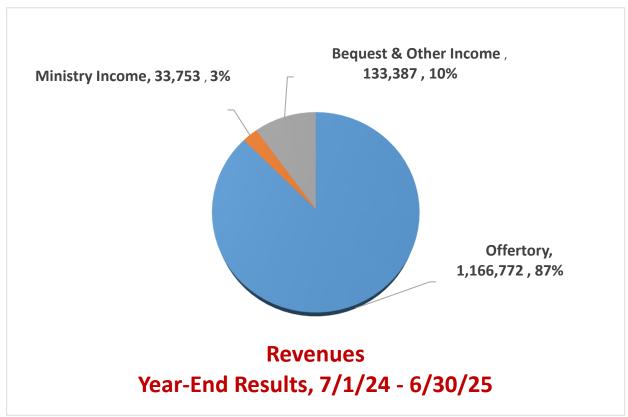

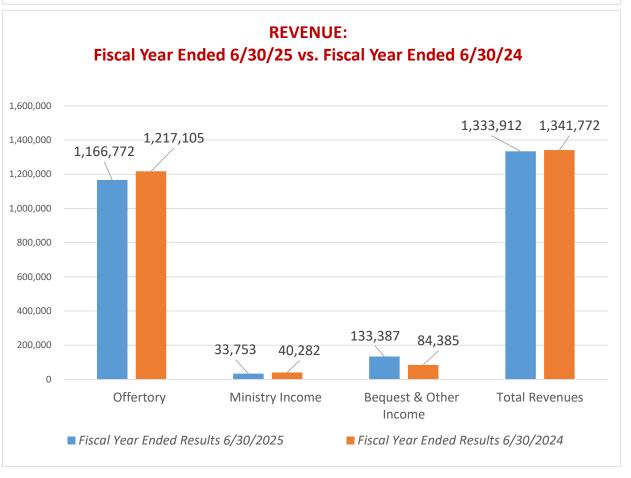
(A) The Chapel Project was fully funded through private parishioner donations. This income is reflected as part of the *Bequest and Other Income* line item.

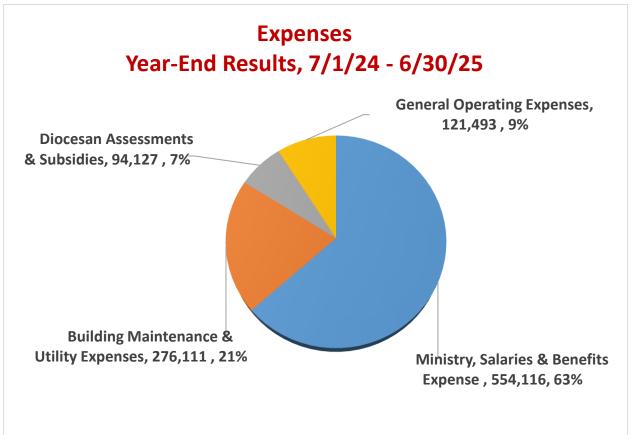

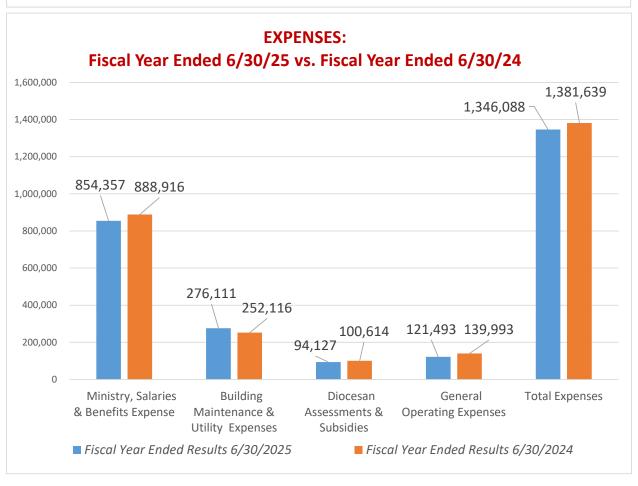
