Alpha: On Mission Beyond the Walls

Our Alpha team's desire to be a ministry on mission beyond the walls of our parish found a response in the hearts of a few parishioners from St. Catherine of Siena in Mountain Lakes. Having previously experienced Alpha here at Notre Dame, they were so deeply impacted by the journey that they felt called to bring it to their own parish. Here is their missionary story:

With the help of Patty Duerr, Rockie French, and their team, we journeyed together with 27 guests from various churches. 



Bible Stories & Great Works of Art: "

My interest in Christian Art began while touring Italy with my wife Chris in 2012. Seeing the beautiful and inspiring sacred art of Michelangelo, Caravagio, Bernini, and others up close was a spiritual experience. It was so enlightening for me to see up close how their beautiful representations of scenes described in the Bible help us to understand and appreciate the meaning of God's Word. I wanted to somehow share this experience with others. With the encouragement of former Deacon Ron Forino and Parish staff, I developed what is called "Bible Stories and Great Works"



I believe that anyone who is either familiar with or just curious about art based on stories in the Bible could benefit. Like me, you don't need a background or special interest in art, just be open to learning more about and experiencing world famous Christian Art and the artists. It will most


The Rosary - Meditating on the Fruits of the Mysteries: "The primary drive that led me to select the Holy Rosary and its mysteries as a guide to meditation is the need to settle and reflect in silence on the many thoughts we entertain—rigorously or not—throughout the day or night. In praying the Rosary, we ask for the loving intercession of our Blessed Mother, who, through her own life and the life of her Son *Jesus as revealed in the mysteries, offers us* guidance and peace for the challenges we face. These meditations are especially helpful for individuals seeking a structured spiritual practice that allows them to reflect quietly on their own thoughts and then join together in a group setting, without the pressure of speaking." 



Catechetical Sunday 2025

Each year, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) designates the third Sunday in September as Catechetical Sunday, which fell this past Sunday, September 21, 2025. 

"The cross and how much God loves us. Jacob and JP brought the Eucharist to the priest."


