## "CORRUPTION"

## Dear Friends:

I recently read a news article about embezzlement in the Vatican. A former president of the Vatican bank and his lawyer have been indicted for a scheme that took place between 2001 and 2008. They are indicted for losses of more than \$62 million from real estate sales.

The scam allegedly involved the suspects selling Vatican-owned real estate at under-value prices to off-shore companies that then resold the property at market, with the suspects allegedly profiting.

News like this is disturbing and discouraging, but it is nothing new. We see so much corruption everywhere, we are not surprised. We see corruption in politics and business, even with non-profits. It is more frustrating when it involves the Church, but we realize that the Church is made of people.

What is more discouraging is that incidents like these break down the trust that has built up over the years between the givers, the donors, and those institutions receiving those funds. This bond of trust is essential. If it breaks down, the charitable organization will eventually begin to break down. This trust, this understanding that the money goes to where it is supposed to, is the fuel that keeps the organization going.

The Catholic Church is a great organization, with many very holy and very good people working in it. It is a holy institution, a good institution, but it is made of human beings, and humans are sometimes weak and often tempted.

During Lent, I have spoken about selfishness and how it is so much a part of our sin problems. There are fewer worse examples of selfishness than some Charitable organization leaders pulling costly schemes in the millions of dollars. So often the tragic cases of stolen funds result in the perpetrators spending them on selfish typical things like luxury items, lavish vacation, illicit behavior. It is very predictable.

That is why we must all be very careful in taking care of the Church's finances. Everyone in the Church must keep his or her eyes open for anything that might seem out of line. The important thing is a quote that you have heard before: "If you see something, say something." We <u>all</u> must keep corruption out of our society.
