#### "HAGIOGRAPHY"

### Dear Friends,

For those who never heard of this word, "hagiography", it is basically the study of the lives of the saints. It has always been a very essential part of our faith to study and reflect on the lives of the saints. They inspire us and make us feel more confident in our faith. From the lives of the saints we learn that human beings <u>can</u> become holy and do good deeds in a difficult world.

The Gospels are themselves, in a way, hagiography. They are an account of the holy and heroic life of Jesus Christ, as well as the lives of the Apostles and the other wonderful believers in the Gospel.

In the past, hagiographers, the writers of the lives of the saints, have and sometimes resorted to exaggerations and embellishments to make their point. If you read the classic "Butler's Lives of the Saints", which was published 200 years ago, you can see that sometimes the author distorted things to make the saints look holier.

As Father Ronald Rolheiser points out in a recent article, these somewhat exaggerated stories of the saints may have been effective in the past. But I think now it is more valuable to see the real human limitations of the saints, because we need to know they are human like you or me. These more realistic lives of the saints are more effective in our "fact-based", scientific world.

Fr. Rolheiser speaks in the article about the "saints" of the world today: celebrities. The celebrities, the rich and the famous are documented in detail in the media today. Many of us may be more familiar with the lives of singers or sports stars than with the saints.

W need hagiographers, we need writers of the lives of the saints. The saints are our brothers and sisters from across the centuries who want to inspire us to live virtuous lives. We need this now more than ever.

Friends may counsel us to skip the Church funeral and just "get it over with," but our faith provides the strength we need to deal with death. The Church has created Rites to help us face the difficulties and reality of death. Every baptized Catholic has a right to a Catholic funeral. The Rites of a Catholic Funeral include Prayers after Death, Prayers in the Presence of the Body, the Scripture Prayer Service at the Wake, the Funeral at Church, and the internment Prayer Service at the cemetery. Together these services not only make up the total Catholic Funeral Service, but also provide the Church's special prayers for the deceased. The Rites also support families and friends who are grieving for their loved one.

Catholics are entitled to a Catholic Funeral whether they are frequent or infrequent Mass attendees.

**DON'T TAKE A VACATION FROM MASS** - The lazy days of summer can make it tempting to be lazy on Sunday and stay home from Mass, but here are 4 reasons to fit Mass attendance into our summer:

- 1. After Jesus' resurrection, the followers came together to keep his message alive and became the early Church. Every time we attend Mass, we help to keep Jesus' message alive.
  - At Sunday Mass, millions of people we don't know are praying for us and with us. Where else can we get that kind of help.
- 2. Attending Mass connects us to the Communion of Saints the saints in heaven, the souls in purgatory and believers on Earth. That's powerful company.
- 3. Mass is the way a Catholic fulfills the 3<sup>rd</sup> Commandment to keep holy the Sabbath day instructions straight from God.
