

Rector's Corner

Epiphany

The Epiphany of Our Lord celebrates the manifestation of Jesus as Savior of the world, a light for the nations. **How is God's love made manifest?**

I continue to reflect upon the beauty of the Advent and Christmas season. Yes, we move on in the commercial world; school has resumed, and we enter into 2019, the New Year, with the Christmas holidays in the rear view mirror. As I examine the rear view mirror, I look with wonder at how communities come together to bring, like the wise men, the best they have to offer to the Christ child. I recall the voices of children in the choir loft on an Advent Sunday evening, singing praises to God with a Carol Sing-Along; gifts collected by parishioners and visitors to help families in need; many more musical events that draw in not only parishioners but friends and visitors, and decorating our beautiful church!

Thank you, parish! May the love of Christ lead us into the New Year. We move forward held in the bosom of the Holy Family into a year that will bring some things expected, many things not expected, but always full of promise: that God's love is made manifest, as light for the nations, here, in you and me. Let us continue to manifest the light of Christ to one another, and continue to completely trust in the work of His Spirit.





The song "We Three Kings"

details the gifts of the Magi, but do you know what you're singing? "Born a king on Bethlehem's plain, gold I bring to crown Him again." This one is the most straightforward - gold symbolizes the Kingship of Christ. "Myrrh is mine: its bitter perfume breathes a life of gathering gloom." Myrrh is an embalming spice. Already at Christ's birth, we have the symbolic reminder of his death. "Frankincense to offer have I. Incense owns a deity nigh." In many religious traditions, incense symbolizes prayers rising to heaven. In some pagan traditions, it is thought to help "call

down" the deity. The gift of frankincense symbolizes Jesus' role as the Great High Priest, sanctifying the world through his sacrifice.

Catholic Social Teaching

The Epiphany of Our Lord: In Christ there is no east or west, north or south. There is no distinction of Jew or Greek, slave or freedom, male or female. We are all one in the Lord. The commitment to life, charity and justice by the church is rooted in Christ who came for each of us. The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord helps us to focus on the reality that we are all called to sit around the table without regard to distinction.
