Rector's Corner

I Corinthians 12:27-31

Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it. Some people God has designated in the church to be, first, apostles; second, prophets; third, teachers; then, mighty deeds; then, gifts of healing, assistance, administration, and varieties of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work mighty deeds? Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts. But I shall show you a still more excellent way.

This week the Diocese of Austin will release the names of clerics who were credibly accused of committing sexual abuse against minors. Bishop Vásquez will publish this list on January 31, as a direct communication from him to the faithful of the diocese. This is a necessary step in finding our way forward, one that may be painful for many. It's about the accountability owed to the Body of Christ and to those who have been victimized by those who were entrusted with the care of souls. To heal, we must allow the Holy Spirit to bring light to places that have festered in darkness. We are called to pray, worship, and love the Church to a better place. This is not an overnight project but an opportunity to heal our clerical culture; to ask greater transparency from our bishops, and to continue to form vibrant communities of faith in which trust for healing, growth and mission can be fostered.

St. Paul's words have always challenged me while at the same time inspiring hope. He understands the human aspects of forming the Church. He understands the terrible ways in which our brokenness can manifest itself in places that are called to Holy Love. And so, in 1 Corinthians, while taking a wayward local church to task, he also calls forth her gifts, reminding her to repent and trust in the love of Christ.

The Body of Christ has many parts, many members and many gifts. In the year ahead I am looking to your gifts. What are your gifts? In what ways are they beneficial to the Church in our time today? We cannot heal unless the Body of Christ offers her gifts at the Altar of Thanksgiving in the Mass, beseeching the love, forgiveness and healing of Jesus. And then lives from the fullness of the Holy Spirit. Even in the greatest of great tribulations and spiritual battles, Jesus is still present to His Church. He still offers us the radical possibility of peace with God and one another.

Romans 8:35, 37

Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Trial, or distress, or persecution, or hunger, or nakedness, or danger, or the sword? Yet in all this, we are more than conquerors because of him who has loved us.

As previously announced, on January 31, the **Diocese of Austin** will publish the names of clerics who were credibly accused of committing sexual abuse against minors. Bishop Vásquez has informed us that the publication of the list is a sad and difficult task, but that he finds it is necessary and just even though it may cause concern and pain in our parish communities. We have been informed that Bishop Vásquez will publish the list as part of a direct communication from him to the faithful of this diocese. The Church's strength relies on its willingness to recognize and correct its failings. The list will be posted in the afternoon on January 31 on the diocesan website at austindiocese.org. In anticipation of this publication, we must pray for the victims and their families, as well as the good priests, deacons and religious brothers and sisters who did not commit these cruelties but now bear the burden of past sins, all of whom need our loving support. Any questions about the list should be addressed to the Diocese at (512) 949-2400. If you have suffered sexual abuse, please report the abuse to law enforcement authorities. If the sexual abuse occurred by a minister in the church, please contact the Office of Ethics and Integrity in Ministry after reporting it to law enforcement.

En anticipación a esta publicación, debemos orar por las víctimas y sus familias, así como por los buenos sacerdotes, diáconos y hermanas y hermanos religiosos que no cometieron estas crueldades pero que ahora soportan la carga de los pecados pasados, todos los cuales necesitan nuestro apoyo amoroso. Cualquier pregunta sobre la lista debe ser dirigida a la Diócesis al (512) 949-2400. Si ha sufrido abuso sexual, por favor reporte el abuso a las autoridades policiales. Si el abuso sexual ocurrió por un ministro de la iglesia, por favor comuníquese con la Oficina de Ética e Integridad en el Ministerio después de reportarlo a la policía.

Catholic Life Explained

Question: This month, we had the March for Life and the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. What does the Church have to say about having respectful conversations between people who disagree?

Answer: Christians are not removed from the world and its conflicts. Indeed, Jesus sends us "to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). Due to the complex nature of the human experience, the pressures of cultures that don't share Christian values, and the difficulty of living the Gospel, even people of good will have conflicts! The Church has disagreements within herself. This has been the case from the beginning. In the letters of Paul, we see him writing to churches who disagree on how to best live the Gospel in everyday life. And different teachers went to cities after Paul and sometimes preached conflicting messages on who Jesus was.

When we encounter people who disagree with us - on topics large and small - we must remember basic Christian values. Respect and compassion are critically important. We need to be good listeners to grasp another person's perspective. This dialogue doesn't mean we compromise our values or deny the truth. We may still disagree, but our conversation can be a lot more civil if we try to understand each other!

1ª de Corintios 12:27-31

Ustedes son el cuerpo de Cristo y cada uno en su lugar es parte de él. En primer lugar están los que Dios hizo apóstoles en la Iglesia; en segundo lugar los profetas; en tercer lugar los maestros; después vienen los milagros, luego el don de curaciones, la asistencia material, la administración en la Iglesia y los diversos dones de lenguas. Acaso son todos apóstoles?, o todos profetas? O todos maestros? Pueden todos obrar Milagros, curar enfermos, hablar lenguas o explicar lo que se dijo en lenguas? Ustedes, con todo, aspiren a los carismas más elevados, y yo quisiera mostrarles un camino que los supera a todos.

Esta semana la Diócesis de Austin dará a conocer los nombres de los clérigos que han sido acusados creíblemente de cometer abusos sexuales contra menores. El Obispo Vásquez publicara esta lista el 31 de enero, el comunicado vendrá dirigido a los fieles de la diócesis directamente de él. Este es un paso necesario para encontrar el camino correcto a seguir, el cual puede ser muy doloroso para muchos. Se trata de la responsabilidad que se le debe al Cuerpo de Cristo, y a esas personas que han sido víctimas de aquellos a quienes se les confió el cuidado de las almas. Para sanar, debemos permitir que el Espíritu Santo traiga luz a lugares que se han llenado de obscuridad. Estamos llamados a orar, adorar y amar a la Iglesia y hacerla un mejor lugar. Este no es un proyecto de la noche a la mañana, sino una oportunidad para sanar nuestra cultura clerical, para pedir mucho más transparencia a nuestros obispos y para continuar formando comunidades de fe llenas de vitalidad en las que se pueda fomentar la confianza, el desarrollo y la misión entre los feligreses.

Las palabras de San Pablo siempre me han desafiado pero al mismo tiempo me inspiran esperanza. Entiende los aspectos humanos de la formación de la Iglesia. Él entiende las formas terribles en que nuestro quebrantamiento puede manifestarse en lugares que son llamados al Amor Santo. Y así se describe en la 1ª de Corintios, mientras toma a una iglesia local descarriada, también invoca sus dones, recordándole que se arrepienta y confíe en el amor de Cristo.

El Cuerpo de Cristo está compuesto de varias partes, de muchos miembros y muchos dones. Este año que entra estaré en espera de sus regalos. Cuáles son tus regalos ¿De qué forma son beneficiosas para la Iglesia de nuestra actualidad? No podemos sanar a menos que el Cuerpo de Cristo ofrezca sus dones en el Altar en Acción de Gracias en la Misa, suplicándole amor, perdón y la sanación de Jesús. Y luego vivir en la plenitud del Espíritu Santo. Incluso en las más grandes de las grandes tribulaciones y batallas espirituales, Jesús todavía está presente en Su Iglesia. Él todavía nos ofrece la posibilidad radical de la paz con Dios y con los demás.
