Rector's Corner

The Light of the World

Twenty years ago, April of 1999, I was received into the Catholic Church at Saint John Vianney Catholic Church in Round Rock, TX. Within the next year the world of Catholic theology was opened up to me. I began to discover who I was as a lay person. Who are the laity? According to Lumen Gentium, the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, the laity are "all the faithful except those in holy orders and those in the state of religious life specially approved by the Church." In other words, most of you! Through Holy Orders, I am no longer a member of the lay faithful, yet we are all one Body: "The laity are gathered together in the People of God and make up the Body of Christ under one head."

I began to realize that the lay vocation is truly among the noblest: "Whoever they are they are called upon, as living members, to expend all their energy for the growth of the Church and its continuous sanctification, since this very energy is a gift of the Creator and a blessing of the Redeemer. . . The lay apostolate . . . is a participation in the salvific mission of the Church itself. Through their baptism and confirmation all are commissioned to that apostolate by the Lord Himself. Moreover, by the sacraments, especially holy Eucharist, that charity toward God and man which is the soul of the apostolate is communicated and nourished."

Who has the most direct access to the mission field of evangelization in our society? You do, the laity!

"Now the laity are called in a special way to make the Church present and operative in those places and circumstances where only through them can it become the salt of the earth. Thus every layman, in virtue of the very gifts bestowed upon him, is at the same time a witness and a living instrument of the mission of the Church itself 'according to the measure of Christ's bestowal'. . . Upon all the laity, therefore, rests the noble duty of working to extend the divine plan of salvation to all men of each epoch and in every land."

The ministerial priesthood is at the service of the lay vocation. We Cathedral priests are at your service not only to facilitate your encounter with Christ in the sacraments, helping you get to heaven. We are also at your service also to help encourage, exhort and equip you to "expend all of your energy for the growth of the Church and its continuous sanctification" and to your very present daily mission, your apostolate to communicate the Gospel to our world.

El Rincón del Rector

La luz del mundo

Hace veinte años, en abril del 1999, que fui recibido a la iglesia católica en la parroquia de Saint John Vianney en Round Rock, Texas. Dentro del próximo año se me abrió el mundo de la teología católica. Comencé a descubrir mi identidad de una persona laica. ¿Quienes son los laicos? Según "Lumen Gentium", que es la Constitución Dogmática Sobre la Iglesia, los laicos son "todos los fieles cristianos, a excepción de los miembros del orden sagrado y los del estado religioso aprobado por la Iglesia." En otras palabras, ¡La mayoría de ustedes son los laicos! Debido a las órdenes sagradas, ya no soy miembro de los fieles laicos, sin embargo, todos somos un solo cuerpo: "Los laicos [están] congregados en el Pueblo de Dios e integrados en el único Cuerpo de Cristo bajo una sola Cabeza..."

Muy pronto me di cuenta de que la vocación laical está verdaderamente entre las más nobles: "[Los laicos,] cualesquiera que sean, están llamados, a fuer de miembros vivos, a contribuir con todas sus fuerzas, las recibidas por el beneficio del Creador y las otorgadas por la gracia del Redentor, al crecimiento de la Iglesia y a su continua santificación...El apostolado de los laicos es participación en la misma misión salvífica de la Iglesia, apostolado al que todos están destinados por el Señor mismo en virtud del bautismo y de la confirmación. Y los sacramentos, especialmente la sagrada Eucaristía, comunican y alimentan aquel amor hacia Dios y hacia los hombres que es el alma de todo apostolado."

¿Quiénes son los que tienen el acceso más directo al campo misionero de la evangelización en nuestra sociedad? ¡Son ustedes, los laicos!

"Los laicos están especialmente llamados a hacer presente y operante a la Iglesia en aquellos lugares y circunstancias en que sólo puede llegar a ser sal de la tierra a través de ellos. Así, todo laico, en virtud de los dones que le han sido otorgados, se convierte en testigo y simultáneamente en vivo instrumento de la misión de la misma Iglesia en la medida del don de Cristo. Así, pues, incumbe a todos los laicos la preclara empresa de colaborar para que el divino designio de salvación alcance más y más a todos los hombres de todos los tiempos y en todas las partes de la tierra."

El sacerdocio ministerial está al servicio de la vocación laical. Nosotros los sacerdotes de la catedral no solo estamos a su servicio para facilitar su encuentro con Cristo en los sacramentos, ayudándoles a llegar al cielo. También estamos a su servicio para alentarlos, exhortarlos, y equiparlos a "a contribuir con todas sus fuerzas al crecimiento de la Iglesia y a su continua santificación", y para ayudarles en su presente misión diaria, el apostolado para comunicar el Evangelio a nuestro mundo.


