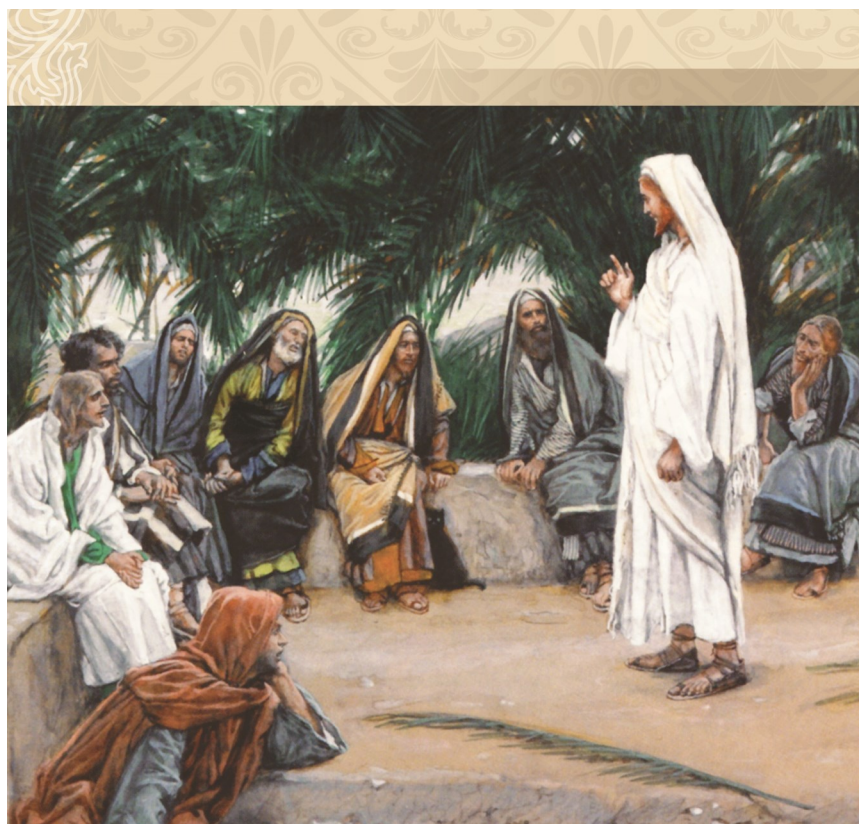

Rector's Corner

It would seem I have collected four different editions of the Chaucer's Canterbury Tales, the original purchase a lavishly bound and illustrated version from my favorite publisher, The Folio Society, in Middle English. True to form, I have yet to read the entire poem, but I am enchanted every time I dip in—from The Prologue of a modernized translation:

*"When in April the sweet showers fall
And pierce the drought of March to the root, and all
The veins are based in liquor of such power
As will bring on the engendering of the flower,
When also Zephyrus with his sweet breath
Exhales an air in every grove and heath
Upon the tender shoots, and the young sun
His half-course in the sign of the Ram has run,
And the small fowl are making melody,
That sleep away the night with open eye,
(So nature pricks them and their heart engages),
Then people long to go on pilgrimages,
And palmers long to seek the stranger lands,
Of far-off saints, hallowed in sundry lands,
And specially, from every shire's end
In England, down to Canterbury they wend
To seek the holy blissful martyr, quick
In giving help to them when they were sick."*

Thus begins the description of the merry band of pilgrims gathering to make their way to Canterbury. Spring is in the air; it's time to make our way to our pilgrim shrine of choice to seek the help of a favorite saint! It may not feel like spring here yet in Central Texas, but I can already see bluebonnets popping up alongside the interstate.

One of the pioneers of the Christian pilgrimage was Constantine's mother, St. Helen. She made her way to the Holy City, Jerusalem, in search of the True Cross. At this time last year I was making final plans for my second pilgrimage since coming into the Church now 20 years ago (which had been marked by a pilgrimage to Rome). I was excited to think about going in the footsteps of Saint Helen to the Holy Lands and was completely blown away by the graces received as I traveled with a merry band of pilgrims from several different states. Pilgrims to a shrine or holy place share a common destination while bringing with them varying motivations. The journey will always have challenges, but as they focus on the common goal, they grow together.

Pilgrims can also be those, who like Abraham, are seeking a promised homeland. In the writings of St. Paul we discover our earthly journey as a type of exile, as we make our way towards the heavenly homeland:

"So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the holy ones and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the capstone. Through him the whole structure is held together and grows into a temple sacred in the Lord; in him you also are being built together into a dwelling place of God in the Spirit." (Eph 2:19-22)

Together we travel the Road of Repentance, the Highways of Saints. We have a common destination, and we gather each week at Mass in anticipation of the unfolding of that journey together, one week at a time. Pilgrims are never alone in the journey, and in fact—as those who have been on the Camino de Santiago share—there are always grace-filled surprises along the way! We need one another, whether we like it or not! To be a pilgrim

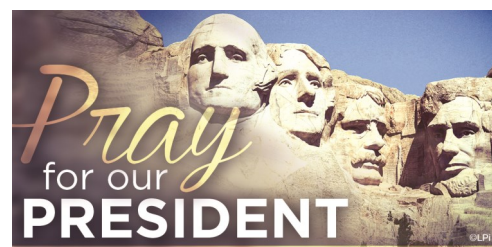

Greetings! My name is Rev. Antony Savarimuthu, and I am a missionary priest from the Diocese of Tiruchirappalli, India. It is with great joy that I arrived to this parish on Feb. 7, and I am most grateful to Most Rev. Joe Vásquez, Bishop of Austin, for assigning me as the resident of Saint Mary Cathedral.

Ordained a priest April 23, 1985, I have served the Lord and the People of God for the last 33 years in various capacities such as associate pastoral care director, pastor, school administrator, and principal in my diocese until 1993. Coming to the United States of America, I completed a Master's degree in Special



Education at Manhattan College, Bronx, NY. While doing my studies, I served as parochial vicar at St. Dominic Church, Bronx, in the Archdiocese of New York. I also received training in Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE), earning certification from the National Catholic Association of Chaplains (NACC). From 2001-2013, I worked successfully as a chaplain at St. Francis Schervier Nursing Home, offering a comforting presence to the residents.

Returning to India in 2013, I was a spiritual director and professor at St. Augustine Seminary in my diocese in India for a short time. Presently, I am coordinating the Mission Appeal program for my diocese, as well as preaching for Cross Catholic Outreach, a Catholic organization in the USA.

I thank Very Rev. Tim Nolt, Rector, and the entire Cathedral staff for their warm welcome.

Al parecer he recopilado cuatro ediciones diferentes de los Cuentos de Canterbury de Chaucer, la compra original es una versión espléndidamente encuadrada e ilustrada de mi editor favorito, The Folio Society, en un inglés medio profundo. Aunque sigo fiel a ese formato, todavía tengo que leer el poema completo, y me encanta sumergirme en El Prólogo de la traducción modernizada:

*"Las suaves lluvias de abril han penetrado
Hasta lo más profundo de la sequía de marzo,
Y empapado todos los vasos con la humedad
Suficiente para engendrar la flor;
El delicado aliento de Céfiro
Ha avivado en los bosques y campos
Los tiernos retoños y el joven sol han recorrido
La mitad de su camino en el signo de Aries;
Las avejillas, que duermen toda la noche
Con los ojos abiertos, han comenzado a trinar,
Pues la naturaleza les despierta los instintos.
En esta época la gente siente el ansia,
De peregrinar, y los piadosos viajeros desean
Visitar tierras y distantes santuarios en países extranjeros;
Especialmente desde los lugares más
Recónditos de los condados ingleses
Llegan a Cantebury para visitar al bienaventurado
Y santo mártir que les ayudo cuando estaban enfermos."*

Así comienza la descripción de un grupo de alegres peregrinos que se reúnen para dirigirse a Canterbury. (Continúa)

La primavera está en su apogeo, es hora de dirigirnos a nuestro santuario de peregrinos de nuestra elección para buscar la ayuda de nuestro santo favorito! Aun no se siente como primavera aquí en el centro de Texas, pero ya puedo ver bluebonnets creciendo a la orilla de la autopista interestatal.

Uno de los pioneros de las peregrinaciones cristianas fue la madre de Constantino, Santa Helena. Que se dirigió a Tierra Santa, Jerusalén, en busca de la Verdadera Cruz. Por esta época, el año pasado, estaba terminando de planear los últimos detalles de mi segundo peregrinaje desde que ingresé a la Iglesia hace 20 años (en cual fue marcado por un peregrinaje a Roma). Estaba emocionado de pensar que podría seguir los pasos de Santa Elena a Tierra Santa, y me quedé completamente impresionado por las gracias recibidas mientras viajaba junto a un grupo de alegres peregrinos que venían de varios estados diferentes. Los peregrinos que van a un santuario o lugar sagrado comparten un destino común, a la vez que traen consigo diferentes motivaciones. El viaje siempre está lleno de desafíos, pero a medida que se enfocan en un objetivo común, crecen juntos.

Los peregrinos también pueden ser aquellos que, como Abraham, están buscando una la tierra prometida. En los escritos de San Pablo descubrimos nuestro viaje terrenal como un tipo de exilio, mientras hacemos nuestro saludo hacia la patria celestial:

"Así, pues, ya no son extranjeros ni huéspedes, sino ciudadanos de la ciudad de los santos; ustedes son de la casa de Dios. Están cimentados en el edificio cuyas bases son los apóstoles y profetas, y cuya piedra angular es Cristo Jesús. En él se ajustan los diversos elementos, y la construcción se eleva hasta formar un templo santo en el Señor. En el ustedes se van edificando hasta ser un santuario espiritual de Dios." (Efesios 2:19-22)

Juntos recorreremos el Camino del Arrepentimiento, los caminos de los Santos. Tenemos un destino en común y nos reunimos cada semana en la misa anticipando y ese viaje juntos, una semana a la vez. Los peregrinos nunca están solos en el viaje, y de hecho, como comparten los que han estado en el Camino de Santiago, ¡siempre hay sorpresas llenas de gracia en el camino! Nos necesitamos unos a los otros, nos guste o no! Ser peregrino significa saber que debemos viajar con otras personas que van a dónde queremos ir. Nos mantenemos unidos, alentando, consolando, exhortando e invitando a nuevos peregrinos en el camino. Ayudamos a los peregrinos menos experimentados a conocer los caminos, y cuando estamos agotados por el viaje, dejamos que nuestros compañeros de viaje nos nutran, edifiquen y ayuden a llevarnos por el camino.

When I was a child, I often thought of the Church as something mystical and supernatural. I wasn't wrong in my understanding of the Body of Christ, for surely the Church has these characteristics. Lo que una vez no podíamos ver, ahora lo vemos. Lo que vimos como un Dios en un lugar distante ahora habitaba entre nosotros. Es uno de los aspectos del catolicismo que más he apreciado a medida que he madurado: para un católico, lo sobrenatural es natural. La comunión de los santos es celestial y terrenal al mismo tiempo.

Las bienaventuranzas nos instruyen sobre esta realidad. El Papa Francisco nos recuerda que la santidad "no se trata de desmayarse en éxtasis místico". La santidad se trata de vivir en el mundo real y hacer cosas extraordinarias con nuestras vidas ordinarias. Nuestro estilo de vida de corresponsabilidad consiste en acciones en el mundo natural que tienen repercusiones extraordinarias.

Nunca des por hecho tus acciones simples de generosidad y amor. Como discípulos llamados a una vida de corresponsabilidad, participamos en algo más profundo de lo que podemos ver. Estamos bendecidos de ser llamados a seguir a Jesús, y traemos bendiciones a todos aquellos con quienes elegimos compartirnos.

Catholic Life Explained

Question: I've noticed that when I go to Mass at different parishes, sometimes people say and do different things. Why is that?

Answer: The Mass in its current form has taken shape over the course of 2,000 years. Over time, traditions, structures, and prayers have been put into place. There are certain rubrics for the Mass that are normative wherever you go. This means you could attend Mass in Malawi or Thailand or Italy and still watch the same basic liturgy unfold, even if you don't understand the language. There may be some cultural differences from place to place, things that aren't specifically listed. For example, in the United States most people go up for Communion in a nice neat line. In Europe, everyone gets up around the same time. It's a bit of a free-for-all!

Some people might take it upon themselves to change things individually. People may not like something that feels too "liberal" or "conservative," and they may take a well-meaning stance in the opposite direction. When people (including the presiders) do things that are distracting or change the liturgy, it introduces an element that breaks the unity of the assembled community. The important thing to remember is that we gather as the Body of Christ to celebrate the Eucharist. If you are confused, ask! If you are frustrated, pray for the spirit of charity.
