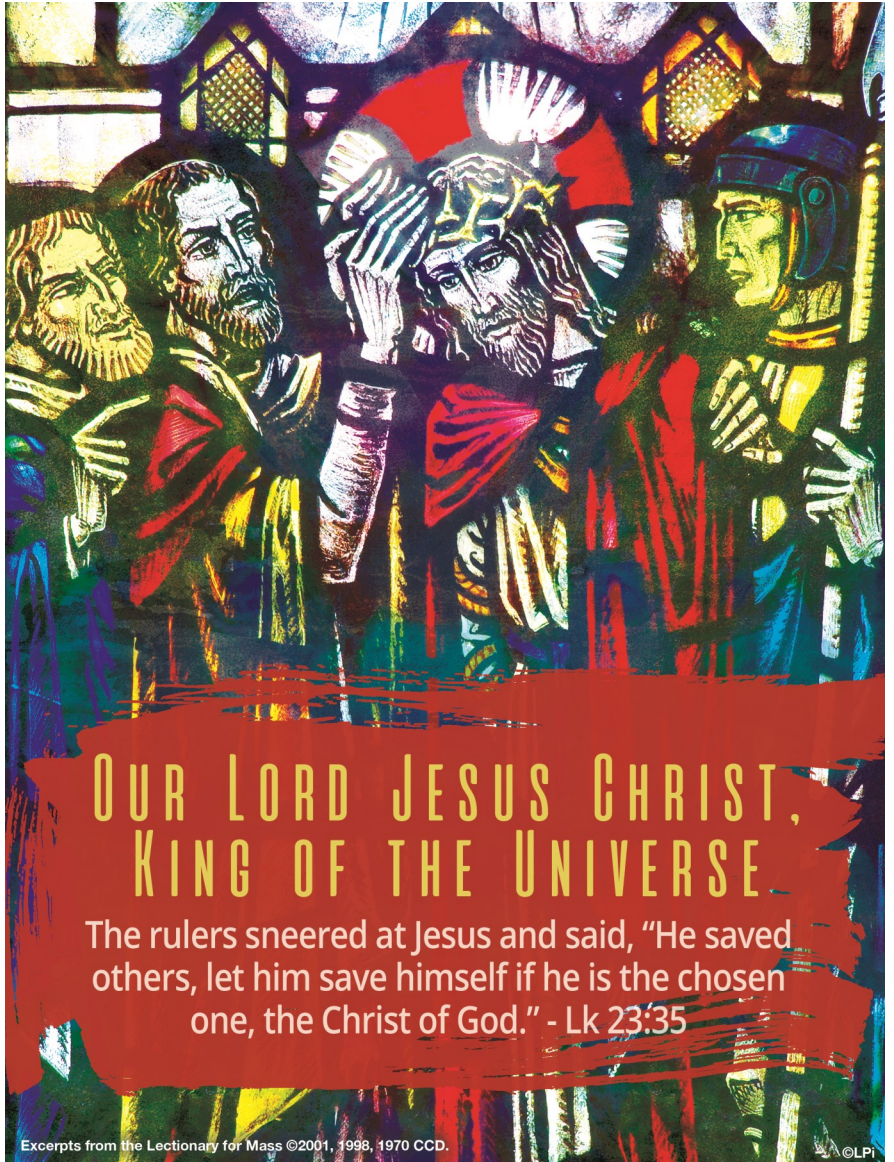

Gospel Meditation

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe *Luke 23:35-43*

"The rulers sneered ... the soldiers jeered ... one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus." Is this the King of the Jews, the King of the Universe? If it is so, perhaps his kingdom is not at all what we would expect! In his letter to the laity, St. John Paul II spoke about how Christians share in the kingly mission of Christ. First, "they exercise their kingship as Christians, above all in the spiritual combat in which they seek to overcome in themselves the kingdom of sin." In other words, before we give any thought to transforming society, we must first allow God to transform us. Through daily prayer, regular self-examination, and frequent confession, we can recognize our faults more readily and choose love instead!

Second, St. John Paul II writes that the laity "make[s] a gift of themselves so as to serve, in justice and in charity, Jesus who is himself present in all his brothers and sisters, above all in the very least." Christ's kingship, and our own participation in it, requires us to look beyond the privileged of society. It goes beyond networking and struggles of power. It goes with Jesus to the Cross!

Still, the kingship of Christ ought to effect society. "The lay faithful are called to restore to creation all its original value ... ordering creation to the authentic well-being of humanity." Jesus does this in a radical way through his death and resurrection. We, too, are invited to bring new life to the world around us. This means holding the world and everything in it as sacred. It means advocating for civil policies that respect life and paying special care to the vulnerable and marginalized in every stage of life. It means being disciples of Jesus, inviting people into authentic love so that one day we will together "be with [him] in Paradise!"

Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo *Lc 23, 35-43*

Hoy terminamos el Año Litúrgico del ciclo "C". El próximo domingo será el primer Domingo de Adviento e iniciaremos el ciclo "A". Durante el año que termina escuchamos el Evangelio de Lucas. Con el ciclo "A" se dará inicio al Evangelio de Mateo. Hoy celebramos la Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo. "Digno es el Cordero degollado de recibir poder y riqueza, sabiduría y fuerza, honor, gloria y alabanza... Al que está sentado en el trono y al Cordero, la alabanza, el honor, la gloria y el poder por los siglos de los siglos." (Apocalipsis 5:12-13). Por eso necesitamos que Cristo reine en nuestra inteligencia, en nuestra voluntad, en nuestro corazón y en nuestro cuerpo, como dijo el Papa Pío XII.

En la oración colectiva tendremos la oportunidad de meditar Sobre Jesús como Rey: "Dios todopoderoso y eterno, que quisiste fundamentar todas las cosas en tu Hijo muy amado, Rey del universo, concede, benigno, que toda la creación, liberada de la esclavitud del pecado, sirva a tu majestad y te alabe eternamente. Por nuestro Señor Jesucristo que vive y reina por los siglos de siglos, Amén." El Papa Francisco nos dice: "El Mesías de Dios, el Elegido, el Rey" (Lucas 23:35-37) se presenta sin poder y sin gloria; está en la cruz, donde parece más un vencido que un vencedor. Su realeza es paradójica: su trono es la cruz; su corona es de espinas; no tiene cetro, pero le ponen una caña en la mano; no viste suntuosamente, pero es privado de la túnica; no tiene anillos deslumbrantes en los dedos, sino sus manos están traspasadas por los clavos; no posee un tesoro, pero es vendido por treinta monedas."

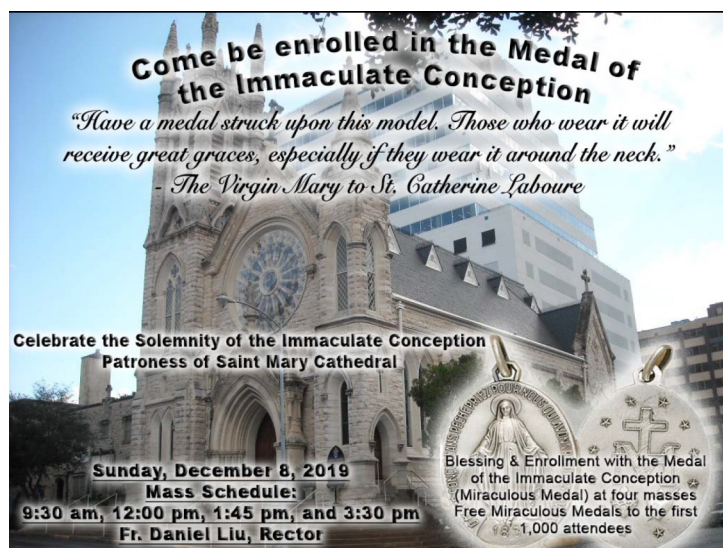

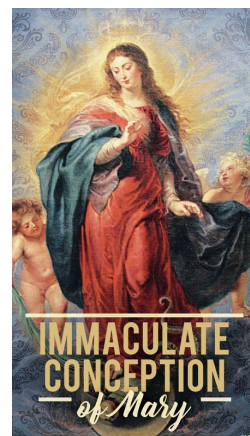

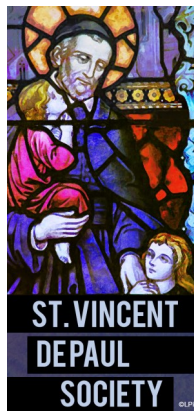

Ethics in Ministry**EIM WORKSHOP**

All clergy, religious, seminarians and employees, and adult volunteers serving in a ministry requiring EIM compliance, must submit an EIM Application for Ministry (one-time only) and attend an EIM Workshop at least once every 3 years. Go to www.eappsdb.com/austin to submit a new application or login to your existing account to find the list of workshops and signup (use "**Forgot User ID/Password?**" if you don't recall ID/password). Contact your parish EIM site administrator (insert name) if a paper EIM application or other assistance with EIM compliance matters is needed.

Workshop Notes: 1) attendees must pre-register at least 24 hours before Workshop start time – walk-ins are no longer admitted, 2) arrive early - late arrivals are not admitted and 3) do not bring children to the EIM workshop. If you are a victim of sexual abuse and have concerns regarding your attendance at a workshop, contact Emily Hurlimann at 512-949-2447 to discuss an alternative workshop arrangement.

We Are Called to Be Saints

Catholics often are drawn to saints due to their profession, hobbies, or ethnic background. One's patron saint serves as an example of how to live a life of holiness and service to God. We hold up the saints of the Church in high regard. However, we can sometimes make the mistake of seeing them as the subject of stories in print and not real living people. We can assume that their level of devotion and holiness is unattainable. In fact, we are all called to be saints.

Our world needs more living saints living out their stewardship in a radical manner. Stories are valuable, but when others get to see disciples of Jesus Christ answering their call in person, consider the impact. There is a reason why lay witnessing is so important in cultivating a stewardship culture in a parish community. The people we can see and hear are alive right in front of us. Some will say that to truly be humble means to act anonymously, but we are not speaking here of actions that call out, “Look at me!” We are talking about acting in a way that people see not you and me, but Jesus instead.

We are to be models and examples to one another. We are to build up one another and make the Body of Christ strong. Don't sit back wishing you had the strength to be a saint. You have already been given the gifts needed to be the saint you are called to be. Maybe people will read about you later, but the Church needs you now!

Estamos Llamados a ser Santos

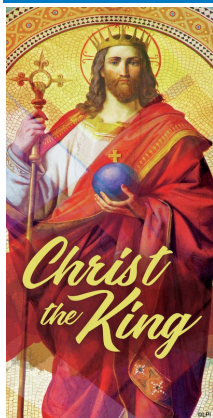
