GOSPEL MEDITATION

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mt 13:1-23

Using the best seeds doesn't always guarantee the best plants. An older Italian gentleman straight from Italy gave me these amazing tomato seeds that he claimed produced the best tomatoes ever grown. Without doubt, the fruit he shared with me was a testament to that fact. These tomatoes were amazing! I couldn't wait until the next growing season to plant these seeds and harvest my own tomatoes. The whole experiment ended up a failure. I did everything the gentleman said, but my fruit didn't even come close. What happened? At first I was perplexed, then some years later the light dawned. The problem wasn't the seeds, it was the soil!

You cannot sow seeds in any old place and in a haphazard way and expect them to be at their best. It doesn't work that way. Planting the seeds is the easiest part. Preparing the soil is the challenge. Tilling, mulching, enriching, and building up the nutrients are all required for good fruit. Then after the seeds are planted, more care is required in order to maintain that healthy, nutrient rich environment for those seeds to sprout, grow, and flourish. God happily sows the seeds of his Word. What do we do with them?

If we expect to be a passive bystander and have good fruit magically grow, we are mistaken. Bearing the good fruit of God's Word requires preparation and work. We have to cultivate the soil of our lives so that those seeds can find a proper home. This one thing alone takes a great deal of patience, time, and effort. What kind of preparation have we put into our lives so that we can be a recipient of God's seed? It takes a great deal of soul-searching and ego-checking to properly prepare. God is the ever faithful and persistent sower. If the seeds do not bear fruit the first time, God will come back time and time again, giving it another try.

If we have created a suitable bed for sowing, then once the seed is sown, we must properly maintain them. What is our maintenance plan for the seeds of God's Word? We need not only a source for water but a watering schedule. We need to weed, aerate the soil, nurture the young plants, protect them, and provide proper nutrients. What does our spiritual maintenance plan look like? If we have done all things well, imagine what the seeds of God's Word could produce in us!

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XV Domingo Ordinario

Mt 13, 1-23

Las palabras de Isaías en la lectura de este domingo anticipan la bondad y abundancia de Dios en la parábola del sembrador pronunciada en los labios de Jesús. "Como baja la lluvia y la nieve de los cielos y no vuelven allá sin haber empapado la tierra, sin haberla fecundado y haberla hecho germinar, para que dé la simiente para el sembrador el pan para comer, así será la palabra que salga de mi boca. Dios espera corazones con esperanza y llenos de fe y gratitud. El Evangelio nos narra que mucha gente estuvo alrededor de Jesús cuando él explicó esta parábola. ¿Qué fue lo que ellos escucharon? Escucharon hablar de un sembrador, de la semilla, de cómo cae la semilla en la tierra, y del cuidado que se debe tener para que dé fruto. ¿Cómo cuido a mi familia para que crezca en compasión y amor de unos para con los otros?

¿Qué tipo de abono y cuidado le doy a mi esposa, esposo e hijos? Este es un reto, el saber trabajar la tierra de cada corazón. En resumen, lo que Dios desea de nosotros es que demos fruto en abundancia.



Meet Father Will Rooney!

Howdy, Cathedral family,

I wanted to take a moment to introduce myself. My name is Fr. Will Rooney, and I'm your new parochial vicar here at the Cathedral ("Parochial vicar" is Church-speak for assistant priest.).



I was raised in College Station and attended St. Thomas Aquinas Parish during my growing-up years. I have two younger brothers. When I was 7 or 8 years old, I first thought of being a priest. It was around the time of my First Communion and when I had begun altar serving.

During high school at A&M Consolidated, I was involved in 4-H and FFA through which I raised turkeys, chickens, and steers and was involved with B.E.S.T. Robotics. Graduating from high school in 2009, I went on to become a proud member of the Fightin' Texas Aggie Class of 2013, studying biological and agricultural engineering. During college I worked both at an engineering lab on campus and as a middle school youth minister (among other jobs). Through these jobs and the formation I received from family, friends, priests, and St. Mary's Catholic Center, I grew in relationship with Jesus Christ and learned to spend time with him in prayer. The desire for the priesthood, which I first encountered as a child, began to grow commensurately with my relationship with Jesus. I decided to apply for seminary during my final year at A&M.

Attending pre-theology at Holy Trinity Seminary in Irving, I continued to grow and discern a call to priesthood; then I began my theological studies at St. Mary Seminary in Houston. After two years there, I was sent to St. Louis, King of France, Catholic Church and School in Austin, for my pastoral year internship. In the summer of 2018, my studies took place in the Holy Land for six weeks, after which I went on a mission to Honduras. I returned to St. Mary's in August 2018, for two more years of school and was ordained to the diaconate in May 2019. My ordination to the priesthood was on June 27, 2020!

In my spare time I enjoy cooking, baking, reading good books, hiking, and playing Ultimate Frisbee.

I'm excited to be here, to celebrate the sacraments, and to accompany you as we walk together towards the Lord. Please pray that I will grow in holiness, wisdom, and charity as I strive to cooperate with Fr. Daniel in the work of glorifying God through the sanctification of his people.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

Focus on the Good

When I was a child, my mother had a set of sculptures resembling three human heads. One head had hands over the ears, one had hands over the eyes, and one had hands over the mouth. Of course, they depicted the phrase, "Hear no evil; see no evil; speak no evil." I have seen these images repeated many times since then, usually as the monkey heads from a Japanese proverb, which would have probably seemed a little less creepy to me when I was a small child. Apparently, there is no consensus about the full meaning or certain origin of these three images nor the phrase. At the very least, it causes us to reflect on the need to avoid evil and look for the good in things.

As I have lived my life, I have come to believe there are more people who lives their lives in a contrary manner to these images. It is not that they seek evil, but it is as if they "see no good, hear no good, and speak no good." Gossiping is the way they pass the time, and they always seem to find the negative in people and situations. Being a good steward certainly means that we do not seek evil, but more than that, it means that we see the abundance of good things all around us. These gifts of God are big and little, profound and ordinary. By seeing the world in this way, we begin to change our personalities and our overall disposition. We always need to follow a new proverb: see all the good, hear all the good, and speak about the good. Amen. - Tracy Earl Welliver ©LPi

“The Weight of the Glass”

Once upon a time, a psychology professor walked around on a stage while teaching stress management principles to an auditorium filled with students. The professor asked, “How heavy is this glass of water I’m holding?”

Students shouted out answers ranging from eight ounces to a couple of pounds.

She replied, “From my perspective, the absolute weight of this glass doesn’t matter. It all depends on how long I hold it. If I hold it for a minute or two, it’s fairly light. If I hold it for an hour straight, its weight might make my arm ache a little. If I hold it for a day straight, my arm will likely cramp up and feel completely numb and paralyzed, forcing me to drop the glass to the floor. In each case, the weight of the glass doesn’t change, but the longer I hold it, the heavier it feels to me.”

As the class shake their heads in agreement, she continued, “Your stresses and worries in life are very much like this glass of water. Think about them for a while and nothing happens. Think about them a bit longer and you begin to ache a little. Think about them *all day long*, and you will feel completely numb and paralyzed—incapable of doing anything else until you drop them.”


The moral: It is important to remember to let go of your stresses and worries. No matter what happens during the day, as early in the evening as you can, put all your burdens down. Do not carry them through the night and into the next day with you. If you still feel the weight of yesterday’s stress, it is a strong sign that it is time to put the glass down.

LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

Enfócate en lo Bueno

Cuando era niño, mi madre tenía un conjunto de esculturas que se asemejan a tres cabezas humanas. Una cabeza tenía las manos sobre los oídos, una tenía las manos sobre los ojos y la otra tenía las manos sobre la boca. Por supuesto, representaban la frase: "No escuchar el mal; no ver el mal; no hablar mal." Desde entonces, he visto estas imágenes repetidas muchas veces, generalmente como las cabezas de mono de un proverbio japonés, lo que probablemente me habría parecido un poco menos espeluznante cuando era un niño pequeño. Aparentemente, no hay consenso sobre el significado completo o el cierto origen de estas tres imágenes ni de la frase. Por lo menos, nos hace reflexionar sobre la necesidad de evitar el mal y buscar lo bueno en las cosas.

A medida que he vivido mi vida, he llegado a creer que hay más personas que viven sus vidas de manera contraria a estas imágenes. No es que busquen el mal, sino que es como si "no vieran el bien, no escucharan el bien y no hablaran el bien." Chismeando es la forma en que pasan el tiempo, y siempre parecen encontrar lo negativo en las personas y situaciones. Ser un buen corresponsable ciertamente significa que no buscamos el mal, pero más que eso, significa que vemos la abundancia de cosas buenas a nuestro alrededor. Estos dones de Dios son grandes y pequeños, profundos y ordinarios. Al ver el mundo de esta manera, comenzamos a cambiar nuestras personalidades y nuestra disposición general. Siempre necesitamos seguir un nuevo proverbio: ver todo lo bueno, escuchar todo lo bueno y hablar sobre lo bueno. Amén.


