

LETTER FROM BISHOP VÁSQUEZ

September 8, 2020

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

I wish to inform you of wonderful news in the world of vaccines. Recently the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved the request of pharmaceutical provider Sanofi Pasteur to stop using the aborted fetal cell line known as MRC-5 and begin using an ethical animal cell line in producing its polio vaccines. Furthermore, Sanofi Pasteur has made the choice in its development of a vaccine for COVID-19 not to rely on cell lines linked to elective abortion. I publicly thank Sanofi Pasteur for this decision as well as the FDA for its approval.

The Pontifical Academy for Life calls on the Church to continue working to ensure that future vaccines and other medicines are not based on cooperation with practices that violate human life. The Academy holds that all people should have recourse, when possible, to alternative, morally produced vaccines, exhorting Catholics to call upon political authorities and health systems throughout the world to make vaccines that hold to the truth of the Gospel of Life available to all people. Additionally, the Church in the United States remains active in urging the FDA to ensure that a COVID-19 vaccine is produced free from complicity with abortion. This decision from Sanofi Pasteur is an encouraging sign that for-profit companies creating vaccines are beginning to recognize there is no need to use cell lines derived from aborted children.

During this unsettling time in our history, thank you for spreading this great news and for offering your own words of gratitude to <u>Sanofi Pasteur</u>. This is an example of the Church's mission to support scientific advancement that upholds the dignity of the human person and the precious gift of human life.

Estimados Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo:

Deseo informarles de maravillosas noticias en el mundo de las vacunas. Recientemente, la Administración de Alimentos y Medicamentos de los Estados Unidos (FDA por sus siglas en inglés) aprobó la solicitud del proveedor farmacéutico Sanofi Pasteur de dejar de usar la línea celular de fetal abortado conocida como MRC-5 y comenzar a usar una ética línea celular de animal en la producción de sus vacunas contra la polio. Además, Sanofi Pasteur eligió no depender de líneas celulares vinculadas al aborto electivo en el desarrollo de una vacuna para COVID-19. Agradezco públicamente a Sanofi Pasteur por esta decisión, así como a la FDA por su aprobación.

La Pontificia Academia para la Vida pide a la Iglesia que continúe trabajando para garantizar que las futuras vacunas y otros medicamentos no se basen en cooperación con prácticas que violan la vida humana. La Academia sostiene que todas las personas deben recurrir, cuando sea posible, a vacunas alternativas que son producidas moralmente, exhortando a los católicos a hacer un llamado a las autoridades políticas y a los sistemas de salud de todo el mundo para que hagan vacunas que se adhieran a la verdad del Evangelio de la Vida y sean disponibles para todas las personas. Además, la Iglesia en los Estados Unidos sigue activamente instando a la FDA a garantizar que la vacuna COVID-19 se produzca sin complicidad con el aborto. Esta decisión de Sanofi Pasteur es una señal alentadora de que las empresas con fines de lucro que crean vacunas están comenzando a reconocer que no es necesario utilizar líneas celulares derivadas de niños abortados.

Durante estos tiempos de inquietud en nuestra historia, le doy las gracias por difundir esta gran noticia y por ofrecer sus propias palabras de agradecimiento a <u>Sanofi Pasteur</u>. Este es un ejemplo de la misión de la Iglesia de apoyar el avance científico que defiende la dignidad de la persona humana y el precioso don de la vida humana.

Be Sure to Look the Part

I used to coach my oldest son in soccer when he was younger. As he got older, he would go to tryouts for select and high school teams. I was no longer the coach, but I always shared with him one piece of advice before any tryout: Be sure to look the part. I told him that if he showed up looking like a soccer player, there was an increased chance of him being seen as a soccer player. If he showed up looking like a kid that plays soccer in video games as opposed to the real thing, he might not be taken seriously. As he grew older, that same advice was then applied to getting a job. It's advice I have heeded myself all my life. You can even say it is like another common phrase: "Fake it till you make it."

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we certainly do not want to fake it, but we do need to look the part. The world looks at those of us who proclaim to be Christians to see if there is anything to this way of life. If they see us looking and acting like people transformed by Jesus Christ, they will be more likely to take Christianity seriously. If they look at us and see nothing different, then they can easily conclude that there is nothing different about Jesus Christ. He just becomes simply another religious figure of history. Can the world see the power of Christ in you? How will do you look the part?
